TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY

TIME: The Rich Man, Poor Man

Today's readings remind us that the powers we have been given by God, in the form of Time, Talent, and Treasure, are meant to be used for great good, and that failure to do so has eternal consequences.

Our First Reading is again from the book of Amos (Am 6:7). It warns of the danger of complacency. "Thus says the Lord, the God of hosts: Woe to the complacent in Zion! Lying upon beds of ivory, stretched comfortably on their couches...." The Lord says that because of the complacency of the people, "They shall be the first to go into exile, and their wanton revelry shall be done away with."

The tendency towards complacency is perhaps an even greater danger for us in the modern age, with so many conveniences (fast food, home automation, Amazon Prime, to name a few) and so many possibilities for diversion and entertainment (streaming TV, laptops, iPads, cell phones, and the myriad other devices we all use). This first reading is not a critique of wealth itself, but of indifference. The sin is not that they enjoyed good things, but that they did so without compassion, without solidarity with the poor and suffering. Amos reminds us that comfort without responsibility leads to spiritual decay.

St. Paul exhorts Timothy (1 Timothy 6:11-16) to live differently: to pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. He calls him to "fight the good fight of faith" and to hold firmly to eternal life. Unlike the complacent rich whom Amos condemned, Timothy is urged to be vigilant, steadfast, and committed to Christ. Here, Paul places the Christian life in terms of a struggle—a fight, a race, a calling. It is not passive but active. To live faithfully is to resist the temptations of greed, pride, and self-indulgence, and instead to orient one's life toward God, who alone is immortal and dwells in unapproachable light.

This second reading shows us how to free ourselves of this dangerous complacency of which we are warned in the First Reading. Paul instructs us to:

"Pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness."


"Compete well for the faith."

"Lay hold of eternal life, to which [we] were called."

"Keep [God's] commandment without stain or reproach."

Let us notice how active St. Paul's word choices are: *pursue*, *compete*, *lay hold*, and *keep* are the terms he uses to instruct us.

The parable of the rich man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31) makes the message even clearer. The rich man lives in luxury every day, while Lazarus, poor and covered with sores, lies at his gate longing for scraps. When both die, their fates are reversed: Lazarus is comforted in Abraham's bosom, while the rich man suffers torment in Hades. The striking detail is that the rich man is not condemned for actively harming Lazarus, but for ignoring him. That is failing to do the good he is supposed to do. The Sin of Omission! He failed to see the suffering man at his very doorstep. His sin was indifference, blindness born of wealth and comfort. Even in torment, he still sees Lazarus as a servant to send, not as a brother.



"Abraham replied, 'My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented.'" — Lk 16:25

So how can we use our great powers for great good? By embracing a stewardship way of life. By putting God first in all areas of our lives — in the way we spend our time, the ways we share our talents, the ways we use our financial resources. Stewardship living calls us out of our comfort zone and into commitment to the Lord and the things that matter to Him.

Let us examine our lives and make any necessary changes or correc-

tions to our priorities so that we can indeed compete well for the faith, pursue righteousness, and lay hold of eternal life. Amen.

Question: *Why is it so important that we register at All Souls? Isn't it enough that we go to Mass?*

Answer: *Registration is the official way we join a parish community.*

Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering at All Souls is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.
