
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY

TIME: Still Only Servant


A local charity had never received a donation from the town's most successful lawyer. The director of the charity called the lawyer to try to get a contribution. "Our records show you make \$500,000 a year, yet you haven't given a penny to charity," the director began. "Wouldn't you like to do something to help the community?" The lawyer replied, "Did your research show that my mother is ill, with medical bills several times her retirement income?" "Um, no," the director mumbled. "Or that my brother is blind and unemployed?" The director began to offer an apology for asking, when the lawyer continued: "Or that my sister's husband died in an accident," his voice rising with a hint of irritation, "leaving her penniless with three kids?" The humiliated director said simply, "I had no idea." "So," the lawyer said, "If I don't give any money to them, why would I give any to you?"

Our readings today show us that living a stewardship way of life—a life focused on serving God and His Kingdom—is not easy. They invite us to reflect on the themes of faith, perseverance, and humble service. They challenge us to trust in God's promises even in times of trial, to rekindle the gift of faith within us, and to live out our discipleship with humility and fidelity.

We can all relate to the frustration expressed in the first reading (Hb 1:2-3; 2:2-4). "How long, O Lord? I cry for help, but You do not listen!" "Why do You let me see ruin; why must I look at misery?" The Lord knows that the life of a steward is not easy. When we look around us, it can seem as if all our efforts are in vain. We spend time praying, but nothing happens. We are faithful to our ministry, but no one seems to notice. We give generously of our financial resources, but the needs around us remain great. Despite all this, the Lord urges us to remain faithful. "For the vision (the fulfillment of His kingdom) still has its time, presses on to fulfillment and will not disappoint."

Paul, writing from prison, encourages Timothy (2 Tm 1:6-8, 13-14) to "stir into flame the gift of God" that he received through the laying on of hands. Paul reminds him that the Spirit given to us is not one of timidity but of power, love, and self-control. This passage speaks directly to us as well. Faith can grow cold if neglected; it must be rekindled, nourished, and exercised. Paul urges Timothy—and us—to guard the deposit of faith with courage and perseverance. In times of trial, when fear or discouragement threatens us, we must rely on the Spirit's strength to remain faithful witnesses.

Jesus makes that privilege and responsibility mentioned in the second reading above very clear in today's Gospel passage (Lk 17:5-10). When the apostles ask the Lord to increase their faith, He tells them that even a mustard seed-sized faith is all that is needed to move mountains (because it is God who does the heavy lifting). We need only take the tiniest step forward, and He will do the rest. It is a true privilege to cooperate as servants in the work of building His Kingdom.

These three readings together form a powerful message for us today:

- Faith amid trials: Like Habakkuk, we may look around and see violence, injustice, or suffering. We may cry out, "Where is God?" Yet God calls us to live by faith, trusting that His promises will be fulfilled in His time.
- Faith that must be nurtured: Paul reminds us that faith is a gift but also a responsibility. It must be stirred into flame through prayer, sacraments, Scripture, and acts of love. We cannot let it grow stagnant or lukewarm.
- Faith that acts in humility: Jesus teaches that faith is not about power or prestige but about humble service. A true disciple does not seek praise but simply fulfills God's will with love and fidelity.

So, when faced with challenges like those found in these readings and more, what can we do?

- In moments of doubt or suffering, recall Habakkuk's words: "The just one, because of his faith, shall live." Hold on to God's promises even when answers seem delayed.
- Rekindle your faith daily. Pray, receive the Eucharist, and allow the Spirit to strengthen you with courage and perseverance.
- Serve without seeking recognition. In your family, workplace, or in our parish here, do what God asks of you with humility, knowing that faith is lived out in ordinary acts of love.

The Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time calls us to a living faith — a faith that perseveres in trials, is rekindled by the Spirit, and is expressed in humble service. Even faith as small as a mustard seed can move mountains, because its power comes not from us but from God. Let us pray with the apostles: "Lord, increase our faith." Amen.
