
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.



**THE FEAST OF ALL SAINTS AND THE  
COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL  
DEPARTED (ALL SOULS DAY)**

This weekend, as we celebrate All Saints and All Souls, we remember two great truths of our faith: that we are all called to holiness, and that love never ends—not even in death. We honor the saints in heaven, and we pray for all souls who are still being purified in God’s mercy. Together, they remind us of our destiny: to live forever in the presence of God. This year, All Saints Day is NOT a Holy Day of Obligation.

John’s vision (Rev. 7:2–4, 9–14) shows a great multitude from every nation, clothed in white robes, standing before the throne of God. These are the ones who have “washed their robes in the blood of the Lamb.” They remind us that holiness is not about perfection, but about perseverance—remaining faithful through trials, trusting that Christ’s mercy makes us pure.

John tells us (1 Jn 3:1–3), “See what love the Father has bestowed on us, that we may be called children of God.” This is our true identity. The saints are those who lived as God’s beloved children, and we, too, are on that same journey. Though we are not yet what we shall be, we live in hope that one day we will see God as He is.

In the Beatitudes (Mt 5:1–12a), Jesus provides us with a map of sainthood: blessed are the poor in spirit, the merci-

ful, the peacemakers, and the pure in heart. The saints lived these words not in theory but in daily life. They trusted that real happiness comes not from power or wealth, but from living the values of the Kingdom.

The feasts of All Saints and All Souls remind us that the Church is one family—those in heaven, those being purified in Purgatory, and those still on the journey. We are united in love and prayer. Saints inspire us; the souls in purgatory need our prayers; and we, still on earth, walk in faith and hope.

As we remember them this weekend, let us renew our desire to live the Beatitudes—to be merciful, humble, and pure of heart. If we do, then one day we too will join that great multitude before God’s throne, rejoicing forever in His love.

Since today is also the Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time, I also wanted to reflect briefly in a few sentences on the Gospel of this Sunday (Lk 19:1-10). The Lord extends His compassion towards Zacchaeus, a Tax collector, who is a sinner. Jesus saw that Zacchaeus' wrongdoing was not the whole of him, and that he had within him the possibility of goodness. Jesus' vision of Zacchaeus affected the way Zacchaeus saw himself. Goodness evokes goodness. Zacchaeus' conversion was a conversion to goodness. Each of us has the capacity that Zacchaeus had, though it may be hidden or unexpressed. Each of us stands in need of daily conversion from a closed heart to an open heart, from a heart of stone to a heart of flesh. Amen.



*“Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me. In my Father’s house there are many dwelling places.
