
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

## THE FEAST OF THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA IN ROME

This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, the cathedral church of the Bishop of Rome and the mother church of all Christendom. While we honor a building, our readings invite us to look deeper: this feast is about the spiritual reality of God dwelling among His people. The readings remind us that the Church is not merely a structure of stone, but a living temple built of the faithful, with Christ Himself as the cornerstone. By commemorating this dedication, the Church reminds us that every consecrated church building is a visible sign of the spiritual temple God is building in His people. The physical structure points toward the deeper reality: the community of believers sanctified by the Holy Spirit.


The Lateran Basilica in Rome, dedicated to Christ the Savior, is the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome—the Pope. It is called “Omnium Urbis et Orbis Ecclesiarum Mater et Caput”—the Mother and Head of all churches in the city and the world. This feast, therefore, is not a celebration of marble and stone as mentioned above but of the unity of the Church built upon Christ, the true cornerstone.

In the first reading (Ez 47:1–2, 8–9, 12), Ezekiel’s vision of water flowing from the temple is a powerful image of life and renewal. The water begins as a trickle and becomes a mighty river that brings fertility and healing wherever it flows. This river symbolizes the grace of God flowing from His dwelling place to renew creation and humanity. In the context of this feast, the temple in Ezekiel’s vision prefigures both Christ and the Church. From Christ’s pierced side on the cross flowed blood and water—signs of the sacraments that give life to the Church. The river also represents the Holy Spirit, who flows from the heart of the Church to sanctify the world. Thus, the Lateran Basilica, and every church, is meant to be a source of living water—a place from which God’s grace flows into the world through prayer, the sacraments, and works of mercy.

In the second reading (1 Cor 3:9c–11, 16–17), St. Paul builds on this theme, reminding us, “You are God’s building.” St. Paul moves the focus from a physical temple to a spiritual one. He reminds the Corinthians that they themselves are God’s building, founded on Jesus Christ. The Church is not merely an organization or structure; it is a living temple, built of living stones—each believer sanctified by the Spirit. Paul’s warning is sobering: “If anyone destroys God’s temple, God will destroy that person.” This calls us to reverence for the Church and for one another. Every act of division, gossip, or injustice within the community damages the temple of God. Conversely, every act

of love, forgiveness, and service strengthens it. On this feast, we are invited to examine how we contribute to the beauty and holiness of the Church—not just by maintaining buildings, but by building one another up in faith and charity.

In the Gospel (John 2:13–22), Jesus cleanses the temple, driving out the merchants and money changers. His zeal reveals His deep love for His Father’s house, but His words point to a greater mystery: He Himself is the new temple. The old temple, made of stone, was a sign of God’s presence. But in Jesus, God’s presence is made flesh. When He says, “Destroy this temple,” He refers to His body, which will be raised up in the Resurrection. The true temple is no longer a building in Jerusalem but the Risen Christ, in whom heaven and earth meet.



Through baptism, we are incorporated into Christ’s Body, and therefore we, too, become temples of the Holy Spirit. The cleansing of the temple becomes a call to personal purification—allowing Christ to drive out whatever defiles our hearts so that we may be worthy dwelling places of God.

This feast, the dedication of the Cathedral of the Lateran, challenges us to see beyond architecture and ritual to the living Church God is building in our midst.

- In our parish church here at All Souls or in any other Catholic church, we encounter the presence of Christ in Word and Sacrament. These churches are sacred spaces where the river of grace flows into our lives.
- In our communities, where we live, Lansing, Munster, Dyer, Lynwood, East Chicago, Hammond, etc., we are called to be channels of that same grace—bringing healing, reconciliation, and life wherever we go.
- In our hearts, we must allow Christ to cleanse and renew us so that His Spirit may dwell richly within us.

The Lateran Basilica stands as a symbol of unity for all Christians. As we celebrate its dedication, we renew our commitment to be living stones in the one Church of Christ—holy, united, and life-giving. The Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica is ultimately a celebration of God’s dwelling among His people. From Ezekiel’s River of life to Paul’s temple of the Spirit, to Christ’s risen body, the message is clear: God desires to dwell within us and to make His Church a source of life for the world. May we, as members of this living temple, allow the waters of grace to flow through us, bringing healing, unity, and holiness to all creation. Amen

### Reflect & Respond to Scripture

**1<sup>st</sup> Reading Question:** The prophet Ezekiel envisions a future of restoration and renewal for the exiled Israelites held captive in Babylon. What future do you hope for with your family?

**Our neighbors are impacted by the loss of SNAP food assistance, potential unfunded relief programs, or missing paychecks.**

This October, your prayers and donations helped All Souls' Society of St Vincent de Paul assist our neighbors with rent and food. In-

creasingly, the poor and elderly are calling for advice on where to turn for assistance if their Social Security or public assistance checks are stopped. One elderly caller was going to postpone her surgery if she couldn't find help to cover her deductible.

Some words of encouragement from SVdP leadership during this current struggle:

“Real charity and real justice both require the healing of wounds, the meeting of immediate needs, and the building of systems that don't allow those wounds to be created in the first place. The knowledge to solve ‘the formidable problem of misery’ comes from persistent accompaniment and attentive listening ...”

“Let us pray and labor ‘that justice roll down like waters and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream’ (Amos 5:24). For where politics fail the innocent, God's call remains: Act justly, love mercifully, and walk humbly with your God...”
