

Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Nov 21

**THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:
Witnessing to Christ in a World of Confusion**

An atheist was driving in the country when he came upon a priest and a rabbi standing on the shoulder of the road, fishing. Next to them was a big sign that read “Turn around. The end is near.” The atheist took offense at the sign, so he rolled down the window and shouted: “Don’t preach to me, you, religious nuts!” A few seconds later, the priest and rabbi heard tires screech, then a splash. The rabbi turned to the priest and said, “I told you we should’ve just written, ‘Bridge Out Ahead!’”

A central theme of Jesus’ teaching is the kingdom of God. For six centuries, the Jews had suffered under one kingdom after another: the Babylonians, the Persians, the Greeks, and the Romans. God had made many promises in the past, assuring them that they were special to Him and that they would be blessed in many ways because of His unique love. Even 600 years of foreign rule did not dampen their hopes that God would liberate them from their enemies and from all their suffering.


As we approach the end of the liturgical year, our readings this weekend offer a sober reminder that this life is not our aim and that God’s justice will triumph in the end. Now is the time to get our priorities in order, putting God above all else as His faithful stewards. The readings for this weekend draw our attention to the “end times,” but not to frighten us, rather, to awaken us to live faithfully and courageously in the present. Each reading offers a different perspective on how to remain steadfast in faith amid trials, uncertainty, and the temptation to lose heart.

The prophet Malachi (Mal 3:19–20a) speaks of a coming day that will burn like an oven—a day of judgment when evil will be consumed and justice will shine forth. For the arrogant and the wicked, this day will bring destruction; but for those who fear the Lord, it will bring healing and light. This is not meant to instill terror but hope. The “sun of justice” that rises is an image of God’s saving presence. It reminds us that no matter how dark the world may seem, God’s justice will prevail. Faithfully will not be forgotten. The message is clear: live with integrity, remain faithful, and trust that God’s justice will come in His time.

In the second reading (2 Thes 3:7–12), Paul turns our attention from the cosmic to the practical. Some in the Thessalonian community had become idle, perhaps believing that since the Lord’s return was near, there was no need to work or contribute. Paul corrects this misunderstanding firmly, “If anyone is unwilling to work, neither should that one eat.” Paul’s teaching reminds us that faith is not an excuse for passivity. Waiting for the Lord is not about standing still; it is about active, responsible living. We are called to contribute, to serve, and to persevere in our daily duties.

Holiness is not found in idleness but in faithful labor, in doing ordinary things with extraordinary love.

In the Gospel (Luke 21:5–19), Jesus foretells the destruction of the Temple—a shocking prophecy for His listeners. He goes on to describe wars, earthquakes, famines, and persecutions. Yet His message is not one of despair but of enduring faith. He says, “Do not be terrified... By your perseverance, you will secure your lives.” Jesus does not promise a world free of suffering; He promises His presence amid it. Even when we are betrayed, rejected, or misunderstood, He assures us that not a hair on our head will perish—not because we will avoid pain, but because our lives are held securely in God’s hands. This Gospel calls us to trust in God’s providence and to see trials as opportunities to witness to our faith. The end times are not a threat to believers; they are a call to deeper faithfulness, courage, and hope.



The readings this weekend challenge us to live each day as faithful disciples:

- With hope, trusting that God’s justice will triumph over evil.
- With diligence, working faithfully and responsibly in our daily lives.
- With perseverance, standing firm in faith even when the world seems unstable.

The end of time is not the end of hope—it is the fulfillment of God’s promise. The “sun of justice” that Malachi foretold in the first reading has already risen in Christ. And as we await His return, we are called to live as children of the light—steadfast, faithful, and full of hope. In the end, the message of this Sunday is simple yet profound: Stay faithful, keep working, and do not be afraid. For those who trust in the Lord, the end is not destruction; it is the dawn of everlasting life. Amen.
