


All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

JESUS CHRIST, THE KING OF THE UNIVERSE

The Feast of Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe marks the culmination of the liturgical year, drawing our hearts and minds to the sovereignty of Christ — a kingship unlike any other. This solemnity invites us to recognize Jesus not as a ruler of earthly power, but as the divine King whose reign is rooted in truth, mercy, and love.


The readings for this feast — 2 Samuel 5:1-3, Colossians 1:12-20, and Luke 23:35-43 — together reveal the mystery of Christ's kingship: a kingship that unites, redeems, and transforms. These readings show us that we serve the greatest of Kings, who is at the same time the humblest of Kings. Christ is the perfect model of servant leadership. And what an indescribable privilege that He has called us to be servant leaders and stewards in the work of advancing His Kingdom.

In the first reading, the tribes of Israel come to David at Hebron and proclaim, "Here we are, your bone and your flesh." They anoint him as king over Israel, acknowledging that God Himself has chosen David to shepherd His people. David's kingship is not founded on conquest or political strategy but on covenant and service. He is called to be a shepherd — one who guides, protects, and unites the people of God. This image of the shepherd king foreshadows the kingship of Christ. Jesus, the Son of David, fulfills this promise perfectly. His authority is not imposed; it is embraced through love. He gathers the scattered, heals the wounded, and leads His flock to eternal life. The covenant made with David finds its ultimate fulfillment in Christ, whose reign is everlasting and whose throne is the Cross.

In the second reading, Saint Paul offers a majestic hymn to Christ's supremacy. He proclaims that Christ is "the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation." Through Him, all things were created — in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible. This passage lifts our vision from the earthly to the cosmic, revealing that Christ's kingship extends beyond time, space, and history. Paul reminds us that Christ's rule is not one of domination but of reconciliation. "Through Him, God was pleased to reconcile all things to Himself, making peace by the blood of His cross."

The paradox of the Cross is central to the Christian understanding of kingship: the King reigns not from a golden throne but from a wooden cross, crowned not with jewels but with thorns. His power is not coercive but redemptive; His victory is love poured out. This hymn invites us to give thanks — to share in the inheritance of the saints in light. To belong to Christ's kingdom is to live in gratitude, holiness, and peace, recognizing that every aspect of creation finds its meaning and purpose in Him.

The Gospel presents the most striking image of Christ's kingship: Jesus crucified between two criminals. The rulers mock Him, the soldiers jeer, and the inscription above His head reads, "This is the King of the Jews." Yet amid the humiliation, the truth of His kingship shines forth. One of the criminals joins in the mockery, but the other — the "good thief" — perceives something deeper. He recognizes innocence, mercy, and majesty in the suffering Christ. Turning to Him, he prays, "Jesus, remember me when you come into Your kingdom." And Jesus responds with royal authority and divine compassion: "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with Me in Paradise."



Here we see the heart of Christ's kingship: mercy. The King who reigns from the Cross opens the gates of His kingdom to a repentant sinner. His throne is the Cross, His crown is love, and His kingdom is the promise of eternal life. The good thief becomes the first to enter this kingdom, not by merit, but by faith and trust in the crucified King.

To celebrate Christ the King is to renew our allegiance to Him — to acknowledge that His reign must begin in our hearts. His kingdom is not of this world, yet it transforms this world through those who live by His truth and love. We are called to be citizens of His kingdom by living lives of justice, mercy, and peace.

- In our families, Christ must reign through forgiveness and self-giving love.
- In our communities, He must reign through compassion and service to the poor and forgotten.
- In our hearts, He must reign through humility and faith, as we surrender our pride and selfishness to His grace.

The feast reminds us that every earthly power and authority will pass away, but Christ's kingdom endures forever. His reign is eternal because it is founded not on force but on love — a love that conquers sin and death.

The Feast of Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe is not merely a celebration of Christ's power but of His paradoxical glory — a glory revealed in humility, service, and sacrifice. From David's anointing to Paul's cosmic hymn, and from the Cross to the promise of Paradise, we see one unbroken truth: Jesus Christ is Lord.

As we end the liturgical year, the Church invites us to place our lives under His kingship anew. Let us proclaim with faith and joy: Christ reigns now and forever — in our hearts, in our world, and in the universe. Amen.

DO YOU HEAR WHAT I HEAR?



After Black Friday and Cyber Monday comes **#GIVINGTUESDAY**, the global day of giving that will take place this year on **Tuesday, December 2.**

We did really well last year with our **Raise for the Roof** campaign, and thankfully we haven't had any other major maintenance issues pop up this year. We have, however, heard from several parishioners that our assistive listening system does not always serve everyone well.

The existing devices are well over ten years old, and not all of them reliably work with our sound system. Luckily, an upgrade is within reach, and Giving Tuesday is coming at the perfect time to fund it!



Dear Faith Family,

I hope this letter finds you and your loved ones well. I wish you a blessed Advent season ahead. I am writing to share an annual update on the financial state of our parish and to express my heartfelt gratitude for your continued generosity and support. Attached here on the next page is our financial overview of figures.

Over the past year, our parish has experienced encouraging financial progress. Our assets have increased, reflecting careful stewardship and your faithful contributions. In addition, we received a tremendous blessing from the Archdiocese as we shared the news with you in August, a capital debt of \$4.2 million was forgiven. That was the loan we have carried on the church building for over 40 years. This forgiveness has significantly strengthened our financial position and allows us to focus more fully on our mission and ministries.

While our overall financial health has improved, our Sunday giving remains below the level needed to fully cover our ongoing operational expenses. These include essential costs such as maintenance, utilities, monthly Archdiocesan assessments of \$15,000, and staff salaries. Regular weekly giving is the foundation of our parish's ability to serve the community, maintain our facilities, and support our ministries. We encourage everyone to prayerfully consider increasing their weekly contributions to help sustain these vital operations.

Each year, All Souls participates in the Archdiocesan Annual Catholic Appeal, and we are proud to share that we have consistently met and exceeded our goal, and 2025 was no exception. The excess funds returned to the parish this year totaled \$13,000. These additional funds directly benefit our parish programs and help us continue our mission of faith and service.

We extend our deepest thanks for your ongoing commitment, generosity, and prayers. Your contributions — whether financial, spiritual, or through volunteer service — make a profound difference in the life of our parish. Together, we continue to build a vibrant faith community rooted in love, stewardship, and service.




