
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

# Advent Reconciliation

## FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

The First Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of a new liturgical year. It is a season of waiting, hope, and preparation. As we light the first candle of the Advent wreath, the Scriptures invite us to awaken our hearts, to look forward with faith, and to live each day in readiness for the coming of the Lord. We are living between two comings of Christ. The first coming is that of His coming 2,000 years ago in Bethlehem. The second coming is that which we believe will happen at the end of time when Christ will come in glory. Meanwhile, where can we find Christ? We can find Christ and serve Him in our neighbor, especially in the neighbor who is poor and in need. But we have another task, namely, to make Christ 'visible' to doubters and non-believers.

We are Christ's witnesses in the world. The witness which the world finds most appealing is that of concern for people and of charity towards the poor, the weak, and those who suffer. The generosity underlying this attitude and these actions stands in marked contrast to human selfishness. It raises precise questions which lead to God and to the Gospel. A commitment to peace, to justice, to human rights, is a witness to the Gospel.

While each one has a part to play, what is most needed is the witness of the Christian community. Christians as a body must show forth Christ to the world by their love for one another and by the hope and joy they radiate.

This is also a season meant for preparation. But what exactly are we preparing for? Two things, the celebration of our Savior's birth and the anticipation of His second coming. These are weighty tasks that have eternal consequences. So let us, Christian stewards, make the words of the Prophet Isaiah our motto for the season: "Come, let us climb the Lord's mountain to the house of the God of Jacob, that He may instruct us in His ways and we may walk in His paths."

### Today's Readings

**First Reading:** O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the LORD! (Isa 2:5)

**Psalms:** Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord. (Ps 122)

**Second Reading:** You know the time; it is the hour now for you to awake from sleep.

For our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed. (Rom 13:11)

**Gospel:** "So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." (Mt 24:44)

In the weeks leading up to Christmas, it seems everywhere we turn, we are pushed to spend more, do more, entertain more, and generally rush around at a frantic pace — all to create a "perfect" Christmas day. In contrast to this worldly pressure, the Church's guidance to use these weeks as a time to focus on our spiritual lives can indeed seem like a mountain climb. But the intentional and wise use of the gift of time is exactly what the Christian steward is called to do, and with even greater intensity during Advent.

In today's Gospel (Luke 21:25–28, 34–36), Jesus uses vivid imagery to describe the coming of the Son of Man: signs in the heavens, distress among nations, and people fainting with fear. Yet rather than panic, Jesus calls His disciples to stand erect and raise their heads, for their redemption is near. This is the heart of Advent spirituality: watchfulness. Jesus warns against hearts that become "drowsy from carousing, drunkenness, and the anxieties of daily life." The danger is not only in great sins but in spiritual sleepiness—being so absorbed in routine and worry that we miss God's presence breaking into our lives.

To "stay awake" means to live each day aware that Christ comes to us—in prayer, in the sacraments, in the poor, and in the ordinary moments of life. Advent invites us to lift our eyes from the distractions of the world and to look toward the horizon of hope.

As we begin this holy season of Advent:

- Hope anchors us in God's promises, even when the world feels uncertain.
- Love expands our hearts, preparing a dwelling place for Christ.
- Watchfulness keeps our spirits alert, ready to welcome the Lord at any moment.

Let us enter Advent with renewed faith, confident that the Lord who once came in humility will come again in glory—and that even now, He comes to dwell within us. Amen.
