


All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.



THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME: The Baptism of The Lord

Today marks the close of the Christmas season, but before we fully return to Ordinary Time, we have one greater feast to celebrate — The Baptism of the Lord. The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord ends the Christmas season by revealing who Jesus truly is and what His mission means for us. At the Jordan River, God speaks plainly, the Spirit descends visibly, and Jesus steps into the waters not because He needs repentance, but because He chooses solidarity with humanity. And, as we are still in New Year's resolution season, today's feast is a perfect opportunity to consider the privileges and responsibilities we all share as Christian stewards by virtue of our own Baptism, and how we might live our Baptismal vows out more fully in the year ahead.

On the very day of our Baptism, whether in infancy or later in life, we became adopted sons and daughters of God, members of His holy, Catholic Church. Though we may not have realized it, the moment of our Baptism is also the moment we become Christian stewards, disciples of Jesus Christ, tasked with the work of following in His footsteps day by day and sharing the Gospel message with all those around us.

Our first reading (Is 42:1-4, 6-7) describes some of the infinitely wonderful characteristics of Christ that we, as his disciples, are called to imitate. Through the prophet, the Father calls His Son "My servant whom I uphold, My chosen one with whom I am pleased." Christ's actions are powerful in effect — "He shall bring forth justice to the nations" — yet humbly and gently carried out — "not crying out, not shouting, not making His voice heard in the street, a bruised reed He shall not break..." This is a description of the way of life we must go about in our work as disciples of Christ: humbly and lovingly, without calling attention to ourselves and yet without backing down when the going gets tough.

In the second reading (Acts 10:34-38), Peter proclaims a turning point in the early Church: God shows no partiality. Jesus' mission is not limited by nation, status, or past failures. Peter summarizes Jesus' life simply yet profoundly: He went about doing good, healing those oppressed, anointed by the Holy Spirit and power. The baptism at the Jordan is the beginning of this public mission, where Jesus is re-

vealed not as a distant judge but as One who enters fully into human life to restore and heal it.

Finally, in the Gospel passage (Mt 3:13-17), we see yet another aspect of Jesus in action, this time as He humbly stands before John to be baptized by him. Imagine the Son of God, waiting His turn in line with sinners, seeking baptism. What humility and what willingness to unite Himself

to us our Lord demonstrates by this act. We can do no less as we live our daily lives as His disciples. And when we do strive with all our might to live out our Baptismal call to Christian stewardship, we will experience the deep honor of knowing that we, too, are God's "beloved" sons and daughters "with whom He is well-pleased."

The Baptism of the Lord invites us to remember our own baptism. In that sacrament, we too were claimed as beloved sons and daughters. The same Spirit rests upon us, not for comfort alone, but for mission. Like Christ, we are sent to bring light where there is darkness, healing where there is brokenness, and justice shaped by mercy.

This feast reminds us that Christian life begins not with achievement but with belonging. Before Jesus performs a single miracle or preaches a single sermon, the Father declares His love. Our discipleship flows from the same truth. Grounded in God's love, strengthened by the Spirit, we are called to go forth and do good, walking in the footsteps of the Beloved Son.
