


All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

**FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:
Salt of the Earth and Light of the World**

This weekend's readings serve as both encouragement and clear direction for us as Christian stewards. They leave little doubt about what matters most to God and how He intends for us to use the gifts He has placed in our care.

In the first reading (Isaiah 58:7–10), the prophet Isaiah delivers unmistakable instruction: "Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked when you see them, and do not turn your back on your own." There is no room for hesitation here. Care for our brothers and sisters in need is not optional. The prophet Isaiah speaks to a people who practiced religious rituals but neglected justice and compassion. God rejects fasting that ignores the poor and instead points to a lived faith expressed through mercy.

Isaiah names concrete actions: sharing bread with the hungry; sheltering the homeless; clothing the naked; turning toward, not away from, those in need. When faith takes this form, Isaiah promises that light will break forth like the dawn. Darkness gives way not through words, but through love made visible. We live this reading today when faith moves beyond private devotion into everyday acts of generosity. Becoming salt means preserving human dignity in a culture that often discards the weak. Becoming light means noticing those who are overlooked and responding with compassion. In these moments, God's light shines through ordinary lives.

In the second reading (1 Corinthians 2:1–5), St. Paul reassures us that we need not rely on our own abilities to answer this call. It is the Lord who works through us when we step forward in faith. Paul admits, "I did not come with sublimity of words or of wisdom... I came to you in weakness and fear and much trembling... so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God." Saint Paul reflects on his own ministry, reminding the Corinthians that he did not rely on eloquence, impressive arguments, or personal authority. Instead, he came in weakness, trusting in the power of God rather than human wisdom. Paul's humility is itself a form of light. He allows Christ, not himself, to be seen. His faith rests not on persuasion, but on encounter. This reading invites us to live as salt and light by authenticity rather than performance. Faith shared without arrogance, superiority, or self-promotion carries a quiet strength. When we listen more than we speak, serve without recognition, and trust God's grace working through our limitations, we allow others to encounter Christ rather than ourselves.

The Gospel (Matthew 5:13–16) sums up the message of salt and light. Jesus sends us out with a clear mission. Jesus calls His disciples and us the "salt of the earth" and the "light of the world." But salt loses its purpose if it grows stale, and light cannot shine if it is hidden. Our faith must

be lived openly. We are called to act so that others may see how we serve, how we care for the vulnerable, how we prioritize our families, and above all, how we love God and through our witness, give glory to Him. In the Gospel, Jesus speaks directly to His disciples: "You are the salt of the earth... You are the light of the world." He does not say they should become salt and light; he declares that they already are. This is the stewardship way of life. Let us live it with conviction.

This Sunday's message is not about doing extraordinary things but about living ordinary life with Gospel intention. When faith is lived in this way, the world is quietly transformed, and God's light shines where it is most needed. We become salt for one another by preserving hope, faith, and love in times of discouragement. We become light by encouraging, guiding, and reminding each other of God's presence, especially in moments of darkness.

Taken together, the readings for this weekend reveal a faith that is:

- Concrete, as Isaiah teaches
- Humble, as Paul models
- Visible, as Jesus commands



Whatever we do to help another is going to bring blessings back to us. I'm sure we've all experienced that. I'd like to end with a quote from Patch Adams, a doctor about whom a movie was made several years ago. He is also a doctor who likes to play the clown and bring humor into his healing work. He said, "Hugely important is the way a person expresses thanks for being alive. The person who does so through service will possess a great comfort throughout life."

We ask the Lord to bless us today as we come before Him who is the source of all light, all wisdom, and all blessings. Amen.
