


All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

**SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:
New Standards of Goodness**

Happy Valentine's Day! A young man was poring over the selection of Valentine's Day cards at a local gift shop. The clerk asked if she could help. "I'm looking for your most beautiful Valentine card," he explained. "Something that expresses my deepest feelings." The clerk went to a section of cards and pulled out one that was beautifully embossed, trimmed with lace, and written in an elegant script. "This is a lovely card," she said and read the inside. "To my one true love, the light of my life, the joy of my heart, the very essence of beauty and grace. I love you more than I can say." The young man was thrilled, "That's perfect!" he said. "That's exactly what I'm looking for. I'll take five."

We are full of contradictions and sometimes we really make a fool of ourselves. Sometimes things are humorous and sometimes they can get us into big trouble. As we know, the scribes and Pharisees of Jesus' day were often full of contradictions and self-deceit, convinced they were the truly holy ones and everyone else was great sinners, Jesus tells us if we want to enter the kingdom of God, we have to be better than they were. This week and next He gives us various illustrations of what he means by being better. Basically, He is trying to show us holiness goes beyond external behavior. Holiness must be deep inside of us—that which makes us truly holy is love, love for God and love for each other.

This weekend's readings challenge us to reflect on the true state of our hearts as it relates to stewardship. Do we think of stewardship as something we take care of once a year, simply a matter of ticking off boxes on a commitment card? Or do we choose to embrace it as a spirituality and a way of life that allows us to grow in conformity to Christ every day? These readings invite us to move from a surface-level faith to a deeply rooted way of life. They show us that God gives us freedom, reveals His wisdom through the Spirit, and calls us to live not just by rules but by transformed hearts. Together, these passages challenge us to examine how our daily choices reflect our relationship with God.

The Book of Sirach (15:15–20) presents a striking image: God places before us fire and water, life and death, good and evil, and allows us to choose. This reading emphasizes human freedom and responsibility. God does not manipulate or coerce; He trusts us with real choices that shape who we become. In our daily life, this freedom shows itself in ordinary moments. We choose life when we act honestly at work, even when dishonesty might benefit us. We choose life when we forgive someone who has hurt us rather than nurturing resentment. We choose life when we remain faithful in our relationships and commitments. Sirach reminds us that God's commandments are not traps or burdens; they are pathways that protect life and lead us toward fullness. Every choice, no matter how small, moves us either closer to God or farther away from Him.

Saint Paul (1 Corinthians 2:6–10) speaks of a wisdom that goes beyond human reasoning, a wisdom revealed by God through the Spirit. This wisdom cannot be discovered by intelligence or power alone; it is received by those who are open to God. Paul reminds us that God desires to share His deepest intentions with us. In practical terms, living this reading means cultivating a listening heart. Prayer becomes more than words spoken to God; it becomes space for God to speak to us. When faced with difficult decisions, we rely not only on logic or popular opinion but also on discernment shaped by the Spirit. God's wisdom often leads us to choices that appear weak by worldly standards—patience instead of revenge, generosity instead of self-protection, humility instead of pride. By trusting the Spirit, we learn to see our lives through God's eyes.

In the Gospel (Matthew 5:17–37), Jesus deepens the meaning of the law. He does not abolish it; He fulfills it by moving from external compliance to inner transformation. Jesus addresses anger, lust, truthfulness, and faithfulness, showing that sin begins in the heart long before it appears in actions. Living this Gospel means examining not only what we do, but why we do it. Refraining from violence is not enough if our hearts are filled with anger. Avoiding adultery is incomplete if we allow our thoughts and desires to objectify others. Speaking truth requires more than avoiding lies; it calls for integrity so that our words consistently reflect who we are. Jesus invites us to a faith that shapes our thoughts, desires, and intentions.

These three readings form a unified message. God gives us freedom, reveals His wisdom, and calls us to wholehearted discipleship. We live them by choosing life in our daily decisions, seeking God's wisdom through prayer and openness to the Spirit, and allowing the Gospel to transform our hearts from within. When we live this way, faith becomes more than Sunday worship. It becomes a daily commitment to walk with God, allowing His grace to shape every part of our lives. Through these choices, we reflect the presence of God in a world longing for truth, mercy, and hope. Amen


- Invite parishioners to reflect on their journey of discipleship.




