



## FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT: Struggle Against Temptation

Lent is presented as a time of return to God, spiritual renewal, and growth in obedience, trust, and love. What does that mean for us Christians? Lent is a 40-day journey of conversion in which Christians prepare their hearts for the celebration of Easter. It mirrors Christ's 40 days in the desert and calls believers to deeper repentance, prayer, fasting, and charity. Lent is not merely about giving things up; it is about reordering our lives toward God, resisting sin, and choosing grace over selfishness. At its heart, Lent is an invitation to move from the disobedience of Adam to the obedience of Christ.

The first thing that needs to be said about the temptations of Jesus is that they were real. This was not play-acting. But the question arises, "Can a good person be tempted like the rest of us?" The truth is the good person who resists temptation knows more about its power than the weakling who submits at the very onset of temptation.

As we enter the season of Lent, the Church invites us into 40 days of intentional reflection, repentance, and renewal. The readings remind us that Lent is not simply about giving something up, but about making room for God. For Christian stewards, this season calls us to look honestly at how we are using the time entrusted to us and whether our daily choices reflect trust in the Lord.

The Genesis account (Gen 2:7-9; 3:1-7) presents humanity at the beginning of creation, placed by God in a garden of abundance and life. Adam and Eve lack nothing, yet they fall into temptation because they distrust God's word. The serpent plants doubt, appealing to pride and the desire to control rather than to trust. This reading shows how sin enters the world not through hunger or necessity, but through disobedience and misplaced desire. Adam and Eve choose their own will over God's will, and the result is rupture: shame, fear, and broken communion with God.


This first reading of Lent invites Christians to examine their own temptations: Where do we doubt God's goodness? Where do we listen to voices that promise fulfillment apart from God? Lent calls believers to reverse this original failure by choosing trust, humility, and obedience. Through prayer and self-denial, Christians learn again to rely on God rather than themselves.

Saint Paul (Rom 5:12-19) contrasts Adam and Christ to reveal the heart of salvation history. Through one man's disobedience, sin and death spread to all. Through one man's obedience, Jesus Christ, grace and life are offered to all. This passage reveals that sin is not only personal but communal, affecting the entire human family. At the same time, grace is even more powerful than sin. Christ does not merely undo Adam's failure, He overcomes it completely.

This second reading offers hope and direction:

- Sin does not have the final word.
- Conversion is possible because grace is already at work.
- Our Lenten practices are not self-powered efforts but responses to God's saving action.
- Lent becomes a season of choosing Christ daily, allowing His obedience to reshape our lives and restore what sin has damaged.

The Gospel (Mt 4:1-11) then shows us what faithful stewardship looks like in practice. Jesus enters the desert, fasts for 40 days, and confronts temptation directly. He does not rush past this time of testing or seek to escape it. Instead, He remains rooted in Scripture and attentive to the Father's will. By giving time to prayer, silence, and trust, Jesus reveals that spiritual strength grows where time is intentionally placed in God's hands.



Lent invites us to follow this same path. It is a season to examine whether our schedules leave room for prayer, Scripture, and quiet attentiveness to God. This may require setting aside certain distractions or habits so that time can be reclaimed for what matters most. When we intentionally place God at the center of our days, gratitude deepens, trust grows, and stewardship becomes a way of life.

In summary, the First Sunday of Lent sets the tone for the entire season. Lent is a journey from disobedience to obedience, from self-reliance to trust, and from sin to grace. By listening to God's word, following Christ's example, and opening our hearts to conversion, Christians prepare not only for Easter, but for a renewed way of living in freedom and faith. Amen.

He earned a bachelor's degree in philosophy and pontifical theology at the Pontifical Seminary of the University of Saint Thomas Aquinas in San Cristóbal, Táchira State, Venezuela. He also studied English as a second language at the University of Toronto, Canada. He completed his master's degree in divinity and Pastoral Studies at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, Illinois (CTU). Mario received his diaconal formation at the University of Saint Mary of the Lake, School of Pastoral Leadership, Mundelein Seminary, Illinois.

Deacon Delgado currently serves at St. Anthony of Padua Parish in Roseland, within the Archdiocese of Chicago. He is also a professor in the permanent diaconate pastoral formation program and the school of pastoral leadership, university of Saint Mary of the Lake, Archdiocese of Chicago and serves as a spiritual director.


# GOSPEL


