
All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.



## THE SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT: The Transfiguration

The second Sunday of Lent places us on the road of promise, transformation, and hope. As we continue our Lenten journey, the Church invites us to listen more deeply to God's call, to trust even when the path is unclear, and to allow Christ's light to transform our lives.

Each year this weekend, the Church puts before us the transfiguration of Jesus. His face shone and His clothes became dazzlingly white. We too can experience transfiguration. Virtue transfigures us. But sin disfigures us. Like the story of Jesus' baptism, the transfiguration is an epiphany story. Both stories are manifestations of Jesus as He is, or as He will be. In both there is a voice, and the voice says the same words. A mountain is a place of divine manifestation. The cloud is a sign of the presence of God.

In the first reading (Genesis 12:1–4a), we meet Abram at a decisive moment. God tells him to leave his country, his relatives, and his father's house, and to go to a land that God will show him. Abram is not given a map, a timeline, or guarantees of comfort. He is given only a promise, "I will make of you a great nation ... and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed." Abram's response is striking in its simplicity. "Abram went, as the Lord directed him." Faith here is not an idea but an action. Abram steps into the unknown, trusting the One who calls him.

In daily life, this reading challenges us to examine what God may be asking us to leave behind during Lent: old habits that keep us spiritually stagnant; attitudes of fear, resentment, or control; and comfort zones that prevent growth in faith or love. Lent becomes a sacred time of departure, where trusting God means choosing obedience over certainty. Like Abram, we discover that blessing flows not from holding on, but from letting go. The sacrifices we take on, the spiritual disciplines we practice, and the extra acts of service we perform during this season all give glory to God and transform our lives into a blessing for others.

Lent often reveals the tension between comfort and commitment. Living the Gospel may mean quiet sacrifices:

- Remaining faithful in prayer when distractions are many
- Choosing integrity when compromises would be easier
- Standing for compassion and truth in environments shaped by indifference

In the Gospel (Matthew 17:1–9), Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up a high mountain, where He is transfigured before them. His face shines like the sun, His clothes become dazzling white, and Moses and Elijah appear, representing the Law and the Prophets. For a brief moment, the disciples glimpse Jesus' divine glory. Then comes the voice from the cloud saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am

well pleased; listen to Him." This moment occurs shortly after Jesus has predicted His Passion. The Transfiguration prepares the disciples for the scandal of the cross by revealing the glory that lies beyond suffering.

For our Lenten journey, this Gospel speaks powerfully:

- Prayer is our mountain, where Christ reveals himself more clearly
- Listening to Jesus shapes our choices, priorities, and relationships
- Moments of spiritual clarity are given not to escape life, but to strengthen us for it

The disciples must come down the mountain. Faith is lived not in constant glory, but in daily fidelity. Lent trains our ears to listen to Christ more attentively so that, when challenges come, we remember who He truly is.

Taken together, the readings of this weekend, offer a pattern for Christian living. Like Abram, we trust God enough to move forward, even without full clarity. Like Timothy, we endure hardship with confidence in God's saving grace. Like the disciples, we listen to Jesus and allow His light to shape our lives. Practically, this can take form in simple, faithful choices, like setting aside regular time for prayer, even when it feels dry; practicing acts of charity that cost time, comfort, or convenience; and allowing God's word to challenge assumptions and reshape priorities. It prepares us for a transformed way of living, where trust replaces fear, grace overcomes weakness, and Christ's light guides our steps. Let us carry our candles and go light the world.

As we continue this sacred season of Lent, may we have the courage to go where God leads, the strength to carry the Gospel into daily life, and the humility to listen to the Beloved Son. In doing so, the promise given to Abram, fulfilled in Christ, continues to bear fruit in us and through us, now and beyond Lent. Amen.







# GOSPEL

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus showed his closest friends - Peter, James, and John - what heaven would be like. Jesus' friends were amazed to see Moses and Elijah talking to Jesus. Moses and Elijah had gone to heaven hundreds of years before this day. Then Peter, James and John heard God's voice from the cloud. Jesus, their friend and teacher, was God's Son. 




