


All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.



**FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT:
Christ, The Resurrection and The Life**

The Fifth Sunday of Lent draws us deeply into the mystery of life, death, and resurrection. As we approach Holy Week, the readings invite us to reflect on how God's Spirit transforms our mortal existence into a life filled with divine vitality. Each reading reveals a dimension of this transformation: from despair to hope, from flesh to spirit, from death to new life in Christ.

In the first reading (Ezekiel 37:12–14), God promises to open the graves of Israel and breathe His spirit into them so that they may live again. This message was originally addressed to people in exile, broken, scattered, and hopeless. Yet it is also a message for us today. "I will open your graves and have you rise from them." We all experience forms of "exile," moments when we feel spiritually dry, emotionally exhausted, or trapped in sin. God's promise through Ezekiel assures us that no situation is beyond His power to restore. The graves in our lives may take the form of broken relationships, addictions, fear, or apathy. But God's Spirit seeks to breathe new life into these very places.



How can we live this reading this week and beyond; to cultivate hope; even in dark times? When faced with despair, recall that God can bring life out of death. Try to invite the Spirit of God into moments of weakness through daily prayer, asking God to "open our graves," to free us from whatever entombs our hearts. Let us also try being agents of renewal in others' lives by offering encouragement, forgiveness, and compassion. In other words, to live Ezekiel's prophecy this week, is to become witnesses of resurrection even before Easter arrives.

St. Paul (Romans 8:8–1) contrasts life "in the flesh" with life "in the Spirit." To live according to the flesh is to be guided by selfish desires, pride, and worldly attachments. To live according to the Spirit is to allow God's presence to animate every thought and action. "If the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ will give life to your mortal bodies." This passage reminds us that Christian life is not merely moral improvement; it is a radical transformation. The same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead dwells within us. This means that divine power is already at work in our hearts, enabling us to overcome sin and live in holiness.

How can we live this message of St. Paul, which is not only to the Romans but to all of us? We can start by examining our motivations. By asking, for example, "Am I living by the Spirit or by the flesh?" Let us let the Spirit of God guide our decisions, especially in moments of conflict or temptation. Try to practice spiritual discipline in the remaining few days of Lent. Are we regular in our prayers, Scripture

reading, and letting the acts of charity continue to strengthen the life of the Spirit within us?

Today's Gospel passage (John 11:1–45) recounts Jesus' raising of His friend, Lazarus, from the dead. In Jesus' poignant reaction to the death of Lazarus and the grief of his sisters, we see once again how closely our God identifies with us and all of our sufferings and burdens. His tenderness and compassion teach us that we can safely surrender our lives to Him, knowing that He will care for us. His raising of Lazarus from the dead demonstrates His power over all things, even death itself, reminding us that it would be foolish not to surrender to such an awesome God!

How can we try to live this Gospel reading this week and daily? Let us try and strengthen our faith in Christ's power. When life feels hopeless, remember that Jesus stands before every "tomb" in your life and calls you to come forth. Let us respond to His call. Like Lazarus, we must rise from whatever binds us — sin, fear, resentment and step into the light of new life. Let us be part of the community that unbinds others. Jesus told the people, "Unbind him and let him go." We are called to help others experience freedom through mercy, understanding, and support. To live this Gospel is to let Christ's voice call us daily from death to life, from sorrow to joy, from isolation to communion.

As we journey ever closer to the powerful days of Palm Sunday, Holy Week, and the Passion and Resurrection of our Lord, let us intensify our Lenten resolutions and our stewardship way of life. Let us invite the Holy Spirit to take over more and more of our lives. By Easter, we will be freer to rejoice in Him and truly pleasing to God.




REQUEST FOR PRAYERS

Last weekend, we began our tradition of asking the All Souls parishioners to pray for the students and adults who will be making their First Communion and Confirmation this spring. As in years past, symbols bearing the names of those making the sacraments have been made available in the Narthex for people to take home. The intent is that each First Communicant and Confirmand will have someone praying for them as they finish their preparations for the sacraments. This year, while the chalices have only the students' names on them, the doves might also have the saint that each student chose, as well as a prayer intention they are requesting. Please also pray for their intention and that their chosen saint will help guide them on their journey. And, once again this year, you will find a second dove and chalice on which you should write your own name so that the child can pray for you in return. Please take the laminated dove and/or chalice home and leave the plain paper one in the basket with your name on it. If you have not yet picked up a dove or chalice from the table in the Narthex, we invite you to do so and include our students in your prayers.

First Communion will take place this year on Saturday, May 9 at 10:00 a.m. Confirmation will be on Sunday, May 31 at 3:00 p.m., with Bishop Mark Bartosic presiding. Please keep praying for the students until they make their sacraments, and join us for these special liturgies to pray for them one last time.

Why a five-year pledge?




