PASSION (PALM) SUNDAY

Palm Sunday places us at the doorway of Holy Week. The liturgy begins with joy as we welcome Christ the King, but it quickly leads us into the mystery of His suffering and death. The three readings—Isaiah 50:4–7, Philippians 2:6–11, and the Passion according to Matthew (26:14–27:66)—reveal the identity of Jesus and invite us to understand what true discipleship means. They show us a Servant who suffers, a Lord who humbles himself, and a Savior who gives his life for the world.

In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah describes the mysterious Servant of the Lord. This servant listens to God, speaks words that strengthen the weary, and remains faithful even in the face of suffering. Isaiah says: “I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard; my face I did not shield from insults and spitting.” These words are striking because they describe exactly what happens to Jesus during His Passion. He is mocked, beaten, spat upon, and humiliated. Yet the servant does not resist or seek revenge.

Instead, he says, “The Lord God is my help... therefore I have not been put to shame.”

We learn two important truths about Jesus in this reading: Jesus suffers innocently. He does not deserve the punishment he receives. Jesus suffers faithfully. Even in pain and humiliation, He continues to trust God the Father. The Suffering Servant in this reading teaches us how to face suffering in our own lives.

- Listening to God daily: Isaiah says the servant’s ear is opened each morning. We are invited to begin each day listening to God through prayer and Scripture.
- Helping the weary: The servant receives the word of God to strengthen others. We live this by encouraging the discouraged, comforting the suffering, and supporting those who struggle.
- Trusting God in hardship: When we face rejection, injustice, or pain, the reading reminds us that faith does not eliminate suffering but gives us the strength to endure it with hope.

The servant’s confidence in this reading, “The Lord God is my help,” becomes the prayer of every believer.

In the second reading, Saint Paul presents one of the most profound descriptions of Christ in the New Testament. He describes the journey of Jesus from divine glory to human suffering and back to glory. Paul says that though Christ was in the form of God, he did not cling to his equality with

God. Instead, he emptied himself, taking the form of a servant and becoming obedient to death even death on a cross. Because of Jesus’ humility, Paul says that God highly exalted Him and gave Him the name above every name. One day, every knee will bend and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord. We live this teaching of Paul when we:

- Choose humility over pride: Instead of seeking recognition or superiority, we serve quietly and generously.
- Practice self-giving love: True love often involves sacrifice, giving time, energy, forgiveness, and patience for others.
- Obey God faithfully: Like Jesus, we trust God’s will even when it is difficult or unclear.



In a world that often values power, status, and success, the humility of Christ offers a completely different path the path of the cross that leads to life.

We begin this Holy Week with the reading of the Lord’s Passion from the Gospel of Matthew, (Mt. 26:14–27:66). It is fitting that we Christian stewards focus our minds and hearts intensely this week on the steps of our Brother

and Savior as He laid down His very life for us. Before we do so, let us first take a moment to examine the seemingly small acts of stewardship by some people who encountered Jesus during this most eventful week.

One occurred when Jesus gave instructions to the disciples about the room where they would celebrate the Passover. Jesus said, “Go into the city to a certain man and tell him, ‘The Teacher says... In your house I shall celebrate the Passover with my disciples.’” We do not know this man’s name but we do know that he shared the material gift of his home and the gift of hospitality so that Jesus had a place to celebrate the Passover. Little did he know that because of his good stewardship, his own home would be the site of the institution of the Eucharist!

There was also Simon the Cyrenian who offered the gift of his physical strength, helping the Lord to carry His Cross. Privilege of privileges! Consider, too, the actions of Joseph of Arimathea — he generously shared a material gift of the tomb that was his, and he gave the gift of service to our Lord by giving Him a proper burial. Then there were “the two Marys,” who gave Jesus the gift of their time. Keeping watch in a tender vigil after His death, they “remained sitting there, facing the tomb.”

Each of these were simple acts of good stewardship, yet God used them in mighty ways. God invites each of us, too, to cooperate with Him in small ways through the sharing of our time, talents, and material gifts. Small gifts can become mighty deeds when placed in God’s service.

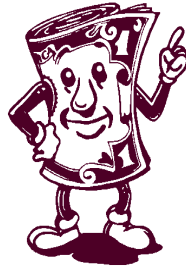

The liturgy that begins this week invites us not just to remember these events, but to enter into them spiritually as we walk with Christ in Holy Week. We live these readings by:

- Deepening prayer, especially through reflection on the Passion
- Practicing humility and forgiveness, imitating the self-giving love of Christ
- Serving those who suffer, recognizing Christ in the poor, the sick, and the lonely

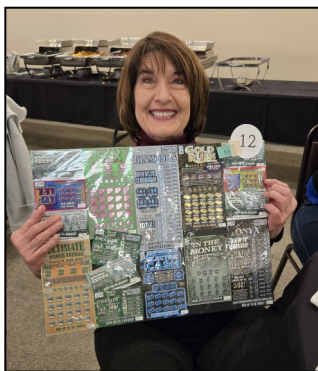

You are Invited to Holy Week at All Souls Catholic Parish

Palm Sunday, March 29

- We begin Holy Week by celebrating Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, where a large crowd gathered and laid palm branches across His path, welcoming Him as Savior and King. Palms will be distributed at all weekend Masses: Saturday at 4:00 p.m. and Sunday at 8:30 & 10:30 a.m.

Holy Thursday, April 2

- Holy Thursday is the commemoration of the Last Supper of Jesus Christ, when He established the sacrament of Holy Communion prior to His arrest and crucifixion. It also commemorates His institution of the priesthood. Holy Thursday Mass will be at 7:00 p.m., with Eucharistic Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at All Souls/St. Ann continuing until Midnight, where we are invited to spend time in the presence of the Eucharist just as the Disciples kept a vigil with Christ.

Good Friday, April 3

- The events of Good Friday are observed in the 14-step Community Way of the Cross that will be presented on a walk down Ridge Road in Lansing, beginning at Noon at All Souls/St. Ann and culminating at Trinity Lutheran Church. Many of us have been attending Stations of the Cross every Friday during Lent, but this live Way of the Cross is a completely different experience—bring the whole family and invite your friends! Additionally, the traditional Stations of the Cross will be presented in Church at 7:00 p.m.
- On Good Friday, we will commemorate the Crucifixion of Jesus Christ at 3:00 p.m. at All Souls/St. Ann with a service that includes the Veneration of the Cross. Traditionally, there is no Mass and no celebration of the Eucharist. Church bells are silent. Altars are left bare. The solemn, muted atmosphere is preserved until the Easter Vigil.

Holy Saturday, April 4

- Bring your Easter baskets and the food that will be prepared for your Easter meal to this special blessing that will be held at 1:00 p.m. in the St. Ann Chapel. Immediately following, we will gather on the Parish Grounds for the Cindy Hope Memorial Easter Egg Hunt for children up to 4th grade/10 years.
- The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night will begin at 7:30 p.m.

Easter Sunday, April 5

Come celebrate Jesus' triumphant resurrection from the dead at 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. Masses on Easter Sunday morning.



All are invited to bring bells to Church during the Triduum to be rung on both Holy Thursday and Holy Saturday during the singing of the Gloria.

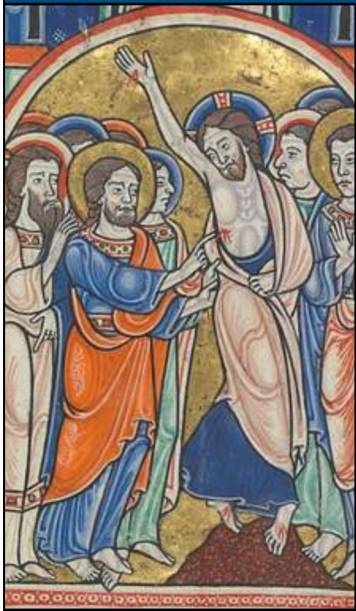

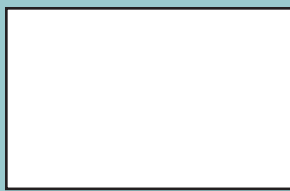

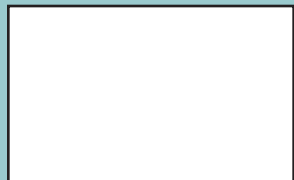
