FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER: Christ the Good Shepherd

The Fourth Sunday of Easter, often called Good Shepherd Sunday, centers on one powerful image: Christ as the Shepherd who knows, calls, and gives life to His sheep. The three readings, Acts, 1 Peter, and John, all work together to show how Jesus leads, how He saves, and how we are invited to respond.

In the first reading (Acts 2:14a, 36–41), Peter speaks boldly to the crowd. “God has made both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified.” His words pierce hearts. The people respond with a simple but urgent question: “What are we to do?” Peter’s answer gives a clear path: repent; be baptized; and receive the Holy Spirit.

A young man was trying to get a job with the circus, any job at all. The manager decided to give him a chance to be assistant lion tamer and took him to the lion's cage. The head lion tamer was a beautiful young lady who was just about to rehearse her act. She stepped into the cage, removed her cape with a flourish, displaying a gorgeous costume and spoke a command to the lion. Obediently the lion crept towards her and then rolled over twice before it sat on its hind legs to beg for a treat. “Well,” the manager said to the young man, “Do you think you can learn to do that?” “I’m sure I could,” he replied, “but first you’ll have to get that lion out of there.”



Just as the lion recognized the voice of its trainer, Jesus tells us in today's Gospel (Jn 10:10) that the sheep recognize the voice of their shepherd. Sheep will not follow a stranger because they do not know the voice of a stranger. There is irony here. John tells us the Pharisees did not realize what Jesus was trying to tell them for they never accepted Jesus as their shepherd. They didn't realize he was talking about them. In the ancient Near East, the title of shepherd was applied both to kings and to gods. The prophet Ezekiel, 500 years before Christ, condemned the rulers of Israel because they were leading God's people astray, and he promised the people God Himself would come to lead His people to justice and holiness.

In today's parable, the first point Jesus makes is to tell the Pharisees and Sadducees they were about to lose their job of shepherding God's people for they did not enter by the gate. The gate represents Jesus, and as the gate is the only way into the sheepfold, Jesus is the only one who can bring us to God. The second point Jesus makes is that His sheep

hear His voice. We are truly His followers only if we listen to Him. There are ways He gave us by which we can hear His voice: prayer, Scripture, and in the voices of those who speak His truth. One who speaks the truth may be a person we like as well as a person we dislike; one who speaks the truth may be a wise friend, a parent, a neighbor, a saint like Mother Theresa, or someone who may not be a saint at all but whose words are true. How we live this reading today:

- Listening for His voice: Through prayer, Scripture, and silence, learning to recognize what is truly from Christ.
- Rejecting false voices: Culture, fear, or selfish ambition that lead us away from truth.
- Following with trust: Even when the path is unclear, trusting that the Shepherd leads toward life, not harm.

The key question to you and me becomes, “Whose voice am I following?” Somehow when we are in the habit of

listening for Jesus' voice through prayer and Scripture, we come to recognize Jesus' words when they come to us through other sources. One such source through which our Shepherd speaks is the hierarchy of the Church (pope, bishops, priests and deacons). As we know, the hierarchy is human and as such has its weaknesses and sins. We who are ordained must go to confession just like everyone else, but despite human weakness and sinfulness, Christ has sent out certain people to speak His Word, and we have to listen to God's Word through those who bring it to us.

To live this weekend's Sunday readings fully as Christians:

- Acts: The Shepherd calls us. We respond with conversion.
- 1 Peter: The Shepherd suffers for us. We imitate Him in endurance.
- John: The Shepherd leads us. We follow Him into abundant life.

In conclusion: Hear the call from scripture, the word of God, or from a voice in your heart, and turn your life toward Christ. Embrace challenges with faith and perseverance. Walk daily in trust, listening for His voice above all others. The Good Shepherd is not distant. He is speaking, guiding, and giving life right now. The real task is simple but demanding: to recognize His voice and follow. Amen.

Peter speaks of Jesus' wounds healing us. Can you think of a time when you have felt healed by God?

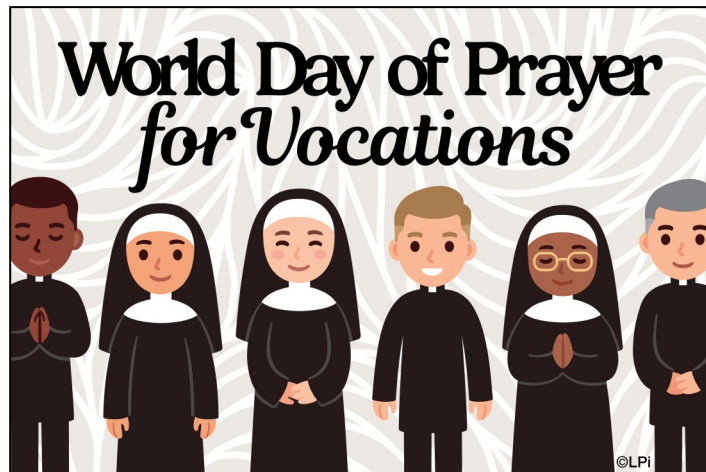
Gospel Reading

Generation to Generation: Building Our Church for the Future
