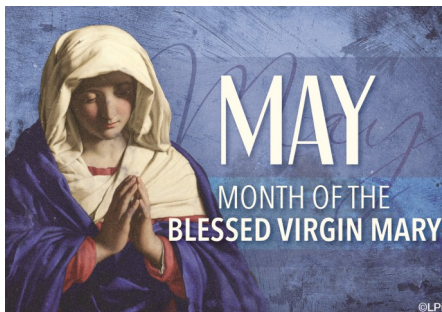

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER: Jesus, The Way, The Truth, and The Life

The readings on this fifth Sunday of Easter present us with themes of dwelling places and home. As Christian stewards, we recognize that this world is not our permanent home. We are pilgrims here, making our way through the stewardship way of life toward our true home heaven. Yet, as we journey toward heaven, we are called to make our dwelling here, whether we live alone or in a full and busy household, a true “domestic church.” In other words, the stewardship way of life begins long before we set foot on parish grounds. Stewardship starts at home.

We see this lived out in the earliest days of the Church in our first reading (Acts 6:7). The community faced a real concern when “their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution.” When needs are not met within the community—especially basic needs—or when a spirit of service is lacking in our homes and relationships, we are not living as the stewards Christ calls us to be.

It's impossible to exaggerate the importance of home. I once was serving to help a friend to do Mass as a Chaplain at a prison, and the warden said, “If you were to give the prisoners a choice between going home and staying here in a luxury suite, complete with color TV, a sauna, a cocktail cabinet, and so on, there isn't a single prisoner who wouldn't choose to go home?”

When things fail, when we feel tired and lonely, there is always home to go to. “Let's go home.” “I want to go home.” How many times and in how many different circumstances have we heard people say those words or have we said them ourselves. Home is where we are safe. Home is a place of communion. If you know you're going home, the trip is never too long or too difficult. We must go out into the world to know how lovely our own home is. Imagine if we had no home to go to.

Nelson Mandela tells how during the long years of his imprisonment on Robben Island he had a recurring nightmare. He says: In the dream, I had just been released from prison, only it was not Robben Island but a jail in Johannesburg. I walked outside the gates into the city and found no one to meet me. In fact, there was no one there at all, no people, no cars, no taxis. I would then set out on foot towards Soweto. I walked for many hours before arriving in Orlando West and then turned the corner towards No. 8115. Finally, I would see my home, but it turned out to be empty, a ghost house, with all the doors and windows open but no one was there at all. (*Long Road to Freedom*, 1994, Little, Brown and Company).

To have a home is not just to have a house. It is to have a set of close ties with people who accept us for what we are, and who give us a feeling of belonging. But despite all the

buildings we put up and roots we put down, here on earth we do not have a lasting home. All we have, as Paul says, is a kind of tent. At death the tent is folded up.

In our Gospel passage (Jn 14:6), Jesus speaks of heaven as a home filled with dwelling places. “In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If there were not, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you?” This is a beautiful image of the glory that awaits us and the personal love our Lord has for us, preparing a place for each one of us who remains faithful to Him.

Let us respond to this great love by becoming good stewards of our earthly dwellings, making our homes true “domestic churches” where we honor God through prayer, care for one another, and generous hospitality. Let us never forget that stewardship starts at home!



The readings this weekend fit together beautifully: Acts 6 shows a Church that serves with order and charity; 1 Peter 2 shows a Church that knows who she is in Christ; John 14 shows a Church that trusts Jesus as the way to the Father. So, this Fifth Sunday of Easter asks us to become a people who are attentive to the needs of our neighbors, rooted in Christ, and confident in His promise. A Church that serves well is stronger in mission. A believer who knows his or her dignity in Christ is freer to love. A disciple

who trusts Jesus can walk through uncertainty without despair. Here are some simple ways we can live these readings daily:

- From Acts 6: Notice one practical need today and respond to it.
- From 1 Peter 2: Begin your morning by remembering, “I belong to Christ.”
- From John 14: When troubled, repeat Jesus' words, “Do not let your hearts be troubled.”

Be faithful in small duties, because the early Church grew through ordinary service. Let us offer our lives as a living stone by making your home, work, and relationships places where Christ is honored.

On this Fifth Sunday of Easter, the Lord invites us to a faith that is alive, practical, and hopeful. He calls us to serve one another with justice, to remember our dignity as His chosen people, and to trust Him in every troubled moment. If we live these readings sincerely, our lives will become a sign that Jesus is risen and still building His Church. The risen Lord does not only save us for heaven, He shapes us for holiness now. He makes us servants, living stones, and disciples who walk confidently in His way.

For a child, home is not so much a place as a relationship of love and trust. A child can move around a lot and not feel homeless, as long as its parents are there. It is the same for those who have a close relationship with God. Amen.

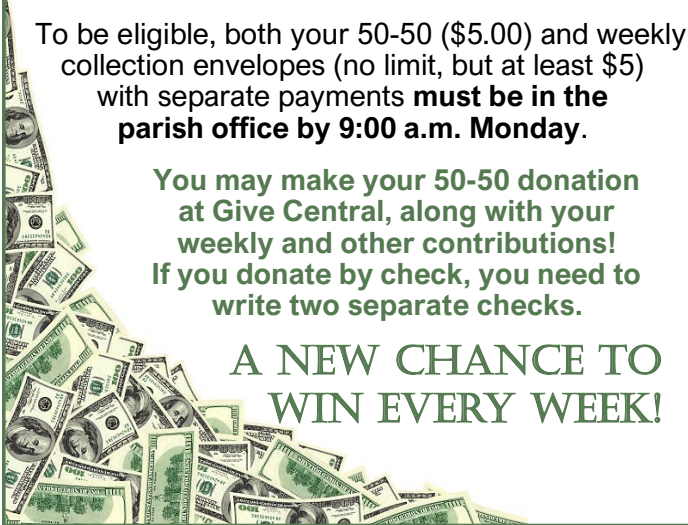

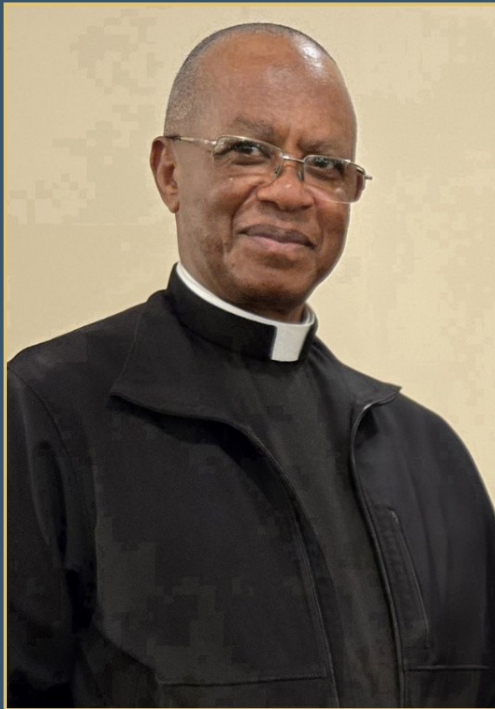

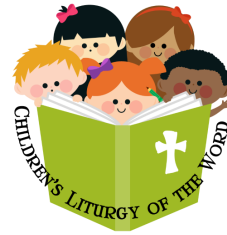

Faith Formation

The Easter season is a time of new birth and celebration. We see this in nature with the growth of grass, and leaves and the first flowers popping through the once frozen earth. We celebrate our release from the cold and dreary days and long nights. In a similar way, we celebrate in church the end of Lent with the joy of the resurrection and celebration of new life in the love of our Lord Jesus Christ.

There is no greater sign of this than when we witness people of all ages celebrate the first time they connect to God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We were blessed to have two adults baptized at the Easter Vigil this year, and they were joined by one person who converted to the Catholic faith and two more who completed their initiation through the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. We regularly see baptisms of the young in church and our Faith Formation students will continue their journeys with the celebrations of Eucharist on May 9 and Confirmation on May 31. Please pray for all these students and those who have recently joined the church.

As our students prepare for their sacraments, we have been instructing them on the beauty and tradition of the Mass. The first communicants have learned how special it is that, by receiving Him in the form of simple bread and wine, Catholics are united to Christ in a way that most other Christians are not. Christ freely gives Himself in the sacrifice of the Eucharist every time we celebrate the Mass.

Let us take a moment to remind ourselves how we should approach the altar and receive Christ in the Eucharist. Whether we are able to receive the Eucharist or not, we should all take the opportunity to participate in the pilgrimage to the altar. Approach with reverence, bowing before the Lord's body and blood. If you cannot receive Christ that day in the Eucharist, cross your arms across your chest to receive a blessing. If you can receive the Eucharist, wait for the Priest or eucharistic minister to greet you with, "The body (or blood) of Christ," and then reply Amen, stating, that Yes! I agree that not only is that Christ truly present for us in the Eucharist but that we are also a member of the body of Christ (please don't say Amen until

after). If you wish to receive by mouth, open and slightly extend your tongue. Do not bite the host with your teeth or expect the minister to put it all the way into your mouth. There is no need to worry about it falling, the host will stick to your tongue. If you will be receiving in your hands, make, as St. Justin Martyr said, "A throne for the king with one hand upon the next." Before walking away, pick the host up and place it into your mouth, and if you like, make the sign of the cross. Remember, we are never to take the Eucharist from the minister, but rather we are there to receive the gift God is giving to us. You then have the choice to receive the blood of Christ if you wish. Always remember to take a moment to stop and show reverence by bowing to the cup even if you will not be receiving it. If you do, follow the same steps you did when receiving the body of Christ, bowing before the cup, waiting to be greeted with "The blood of Christ," and responding with "Amen." And remember, only a sip is needed to receive the full grace of God. Return to your seat and pray, either silently or by joining in the communion hymn.

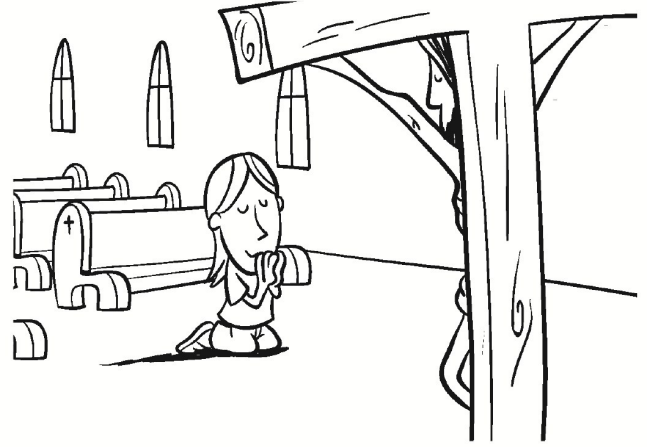

Read about Brianna,* a mother who found support through Catholic Charities: Brianna, a 25-year-old single mom, spent the first two years of her daughter's life staying with friends, worrying every day they would be put out on the streets. Within a month of connecting with Catholic Charities, Brianna and her daughter had an apartment of their own, with the program paying a portion of her rent so she could start saving money, earn her GED, and get a better-paying job. "It takes a strong individual to get through that. But I always had faith."

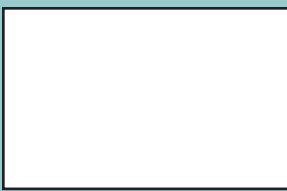

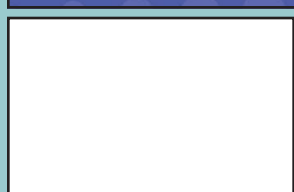

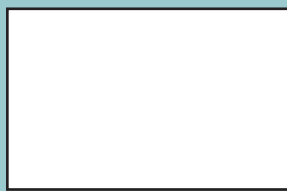
