## SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER: Keeping His Commandments

Today's liturgy gives us a beautiful convergence: the joy of the Sixth Sunday of Easter and the tenderness of Mother's Day. Both themes speak of life given, love received, and a faith that is not merely spoken but lived. The readings show us a Church that is spreading joy, a Christian life marked by hope and courage, and a love that is made visible in obedience and self-giving. They also give us a fitting opportunity to thank God for mothers, whose daily love so often reflects the very heart of Christ. The readings also remind us of both the importance of the Holy Spirit in our lives and the truth that love of God is shown through concrete actions — this is precisely why the stewardship way of life is so necessary.

In our first reading (Acts 8:7-8), the Samaritans had accepted the word of God, yet something was still missing. Peter and John came to them and prayed that they might receive the Holy Spirit, "For it had not yet fallen upon any of them." Only after they laid hands on them did they receive the fullness of what God desired to give. We, too, have received the Holy Spirit — first at Baptism and more fully at Confirmation. The gifts and guidance of the Holy Spirit are essential for living the stewardship way of life. As we draw closer to Pentecost, this is a fitting time to examine our relationship with the Holy Spirit. Do we rely on Him? Do we turn to Him for strength, wisdom, and direction in our daily lives?

Our second reading (1 Pt 3:18) reinforces this call. "Sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts." Christ must be more than a part of our lives — He must be at the center of them. As His disciples, we are called to surrender every aspect of our lives to Him — our time, our talent, and our treasure.

In the Gospel (Jn 14:21), Jesus says, "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments." That is a simple but demanding truth. Love is not only emotion. Love becomes visible in obedience, fidelity, and sacrifice. Jesus does not separate love from action. He then promises the Holy Spirit, "the Advocate," who will remain with us forever. This means that the commandments of Christ are never given to us without grace. God does not command and then abandon. He teaches, strengthens, and accompanies. Jesus also says, "I will not leave you orphans." That line is full of comfort. Many people carry the pain of loneliness, abandonment, grief, or uncertainty. Christ answers that pain with His own presence. He comes to us in the Eucharist, in the Word, in prayer, in the Church, and in the quiet help of the Spirit. In our daily lives, this means:

- When love is tested, choose fidelity
- When temptation appears, choose the commandment
- When life feels uncertain, trust that Jesus has not abandoned you
- When you feel weak, ask the Spirit for strength

Happy Mothers' Day to all our mothers! All over the U.S. today, preachers are likely to preach about Mother's Day. But all those who dare to get up and speak on Mother's Day face at least three problems, or dangers:

1. **The danger of being an expert:** There is the story of the priest who got up and spoke at great length on the glories of

motherhood. Afterward, a woman came up to him and said, "Father, I wish I knew as little about being a mother as you do."

2. **The danger of using Mary as the model of motherhood:** Another priest preached about Mary as the perfect model of a wife and mother. A woman approached him carrying one baby and with four other children following her, and said, "It's easy enough for her with her one child."
3. **The danger of facing a very mixed congregation:** We celebrate Mother's Day, and we talk about and honor mothers. And yet many of our congregation are not mothers, and some, like me, are not married and are not women. Nevertheless, what we all have in common is we've all had a mother. We've all had the experience of a mother and that justifies speaking about her.

On this Mother's Day, the readings help us honor all mothers in a deeper way. A mother's love often mirrors the love of Christ in patience, sacrifice, tenderness, and steadfast care. Mothers give life, nurture life, protect life, and often pray for life into the souls of their children. We thank mothers for:

- the gift of life
- the gift of faith taught by example
- the gift of sacrifice, often unseen
- the gift of perseverance in difficult times
- the gift of love that continues even when unappreciated
- the gift of prayer for their children, grandchildren, and families.

Some mothers are young, some are elderly, some carry joy, and some carry grief. Some are biological mothers, some are adoptive mothers, some are spiritual mothers, and some have mothered many through service and care. The Church honors all of them. Their vocation is a profound reflection of God's own tenderness.

Today we thank them not only with words, but with our respect, our help, our prayers, and our love. If you have a mother still living, honor her. If she has gone before you, pray for her and trust her to God's mercy. And if you carry wounds connected to motherhood, ask the Lord to heal what is broken and to provide the grace you need.

Today's readings give us one message: Christ is alive, the Spirit is among us, and love must be lived. The Church grows when the Gospel is proclaimed, when hope is defended, and when commandments are kept in love. And on this Mother's Day, we give thanks for all mothers, whose love so often teaches us what God's love looks like in daily life. May we live in such a way that others can see our hope, our joy, and our faith. May the Holy Spirit strengthen every Christian home. And may God bless all mothers with peace, health, and the consolation of knowing how deeply they are loved and appreciated. Amen.

On a Mother's Day card, a six-year-old girl wrote her Mother: "Dear Mom, I'm going to make lunch for you on Mother's Day. It's going to be a surprise. P.S. I hope you like pizza and popcorn."

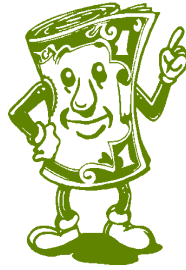
This month, May Crownings take place in many churches in the United States. The statue of Mary will remain in our sanctuary throughout May to remind us of Mary, our spiritual mother.

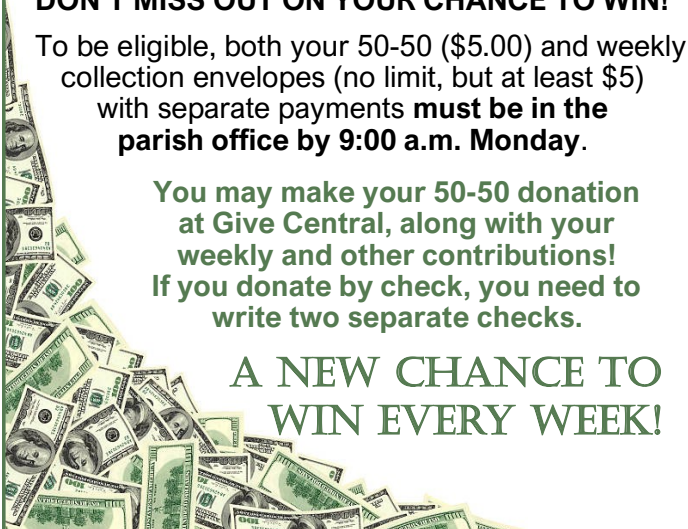

All Souls will again participate in the Baby Bottle Project to benefit the Women's Centers of Greater Chicagoland, a non-profit organization that assists mothers and families experiencing crisis pregnancies by offering emotional, financial, material, and spiritual support through counseling, clothing and monetary provisions, prayer, and other aid. Each year, the Women's Center sees over 5,000 expectant mothers in their three locations, one of which is located at Our Lady of Knock in Calumet City. They estimate to have saved over 40,000 babies and their mothers from abortion since opening in 1984.
