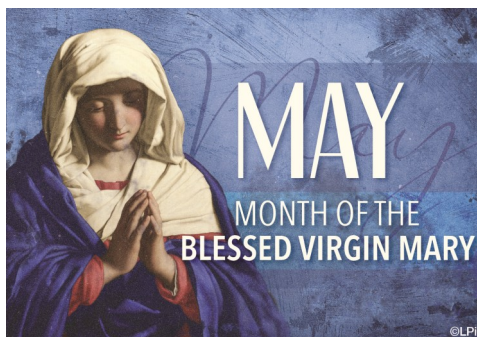

## FEAST OF THE ASCENSION: The Great Commission

Today we celebrate the great Feast of the Ascension of our Lord, the moment 40 days after His Resurrection when Jesus was lifted up into heaven as the apostles watched in stunned amazement. The story is recounted in both our first reading and our Gospel. It must have been an extraordinary thing to witness!

Jesus' Ascension is not His departure from us, but His exaltation and a new way of being present to His Church. These readings show that the risen Lord reigns, the Father has placed all things under His feet, and the mission now belongs to us, as we are reminded in the Gospel this weekend: to witness, to baptize, to teach, and to trust that He remains with us always. The Ascension is a beginning, not an end. Although "Ascension" may sound like Jesus is "leaving," the Church proclaims something far richer. Christ is not walking away from His disciples. He is being enthroned in glory, and from that place He continues to guide, empower, and send His Church.

The three readings this weekend give us not only a mystery to adore, but a way of life to embrace.

The first reading (Acts 1:1-11) tells us Lift Your Eyes, Then Get to Work. The disciples stand looking at the sky. They have just seen the Lord taken up, and they seem to linger in awe and confusion. The angels interrupt their gazing and tell them, in effect, not to remain frozen in amazement. This reading teaches us how to live the Ascension:

- **Do not be paralyzed by grief or uncertainty.** The disciples were tempted to stand still, but Christ calls them forward.
- **Live with hope.** The Ascension reminds us that Jesus has entered glory, and our destiny is also with God.
- **Wait in prayer before acting.** The apostles are told to remain in Jerusalem until they receive the Spirit. Christian mission is never self-powered.
- **Be witnesses, not spectators.** The Church is not formed to watch God from a distance, but to proclaim what you have seen and received.

This first reading makes clear that the apostles were not meant to remain there, simply gazing upward. "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky?" In other words, do not just stand there. Do something. This is a message for us as Christian stewards. We have been given countless graces through the Mass and the sacraments, through the Word of God, and through the many gifts and blessings entrusted to us in daily life. We have been given our time, our talents, our material resources, and the opportunities God places before us each day. Like the apostles, we are not meant to simply receive these gifts and remain unchanged. We are called to put them into action in love and gratitude to the One Who gave them to us. A practical Ascension spirituality can be summed up in this way for us Stewards: Keep your eyes fixed on heav-

en, but your feet planted in service. Pray before decisions. Refuse discouragement when you cannot see the whole road ahead. Trust that Christ's departure is not absence, but the promise of the Spirit's coming. The angels' words also apply to us: why are we standing still? The Lord has already given us a mission.

In the second reading (Ephesians 1:17-23), St. Paul prays that the Ephesians may receive "the Spirit of wisdom and revelation" so that they may know the hope to which they are called, the riches of Christ's inheritance, and the greatness of God's power. This is a profoundly Ascension-centered prayer. This second reading reminds us of the greatness of the God we serve in each other as Stewards of God. St. Paul speaks of "the surpassing greatness of His power," the same power that raised Christ from the dead and placed Him above all things.

This is the God Who calls us to this mission. And He does not ask us to rely on our own strength alone. Stewardship is not simply about what we can accomplish; it is about cooperating with God's grace at work within us. Still, like the apostles, we may hesitate. We may feel uncertain, inadequate, or hesitant to respond fully. How can we accomplish what St. Paul is talking about in this Second reading? Pray for spiritual insight. We do not live well unless we see life with faith. Remember that Christ is above every fear. No political power, illness, injustice, or sorrow has the final word. Act as members of Christ's Body. If the Church is His Body, then our words, choices, and relationships should reflect His holiness. Live with confidence, not anxiety. The risen Lord is not one influence among many; He is Lord of all. Paul's prayer invites us to ask for grace every day. The Ascension tells us that heaven is not empty and earth is not abandoned. Christ fills all things.

In the Gospel (Matthew 28:16-20), we see that the Great Commission is our daily mission. The risen Jesus meets the disciples on a mountain. Some worship, some hesitate, and Jesus gives them His final command: go, make disciples, baptize, teach, and trust His presence. This Gospel shows us that the Ascension life is missionary life.

**"Go"** Christian faith is never meant to remain private or sealed inside the church walls. Jesus sends us outward. To live this command means go to your family with patience; go to your workplace with integrity; go to the lonely with compassion; go to the hurting with mercy; go to the hesitant with encouragement.

**"Make disciples"** Jesus does not say simply, "make churchgoers." He says, "make disciples." A disciple is one who listens, follows, learns, and lives in friendship with Christ. We help make disciples when we speak about Jesus naturally, forgive generously, pray faithfully, serve humbly, and show others how faith shapes real life.

On this feast of the Ascension, let us take time to "look up" and reflect on the greatness of our God and the many blessings He has entrusted to us. Then let us respond as good stewards — not by standing still, but by putting those gifts to work in grateful service to Him, confident that He is with us always.

All Souls will again participate in the Baby Bottle Project to benefit the Women's Centers of Greater Chicagoland, a non-profit organization that assists mothers and families experiencing crisis pregnancies by offering emotional, financial, material, and spiritual support through counseling, clothing and monetary provisions, prayer, and other aid. Each year, the Women's Center sees over 5,000 expectant mothers in their three locations, one of which is located at Our Lady of Knock in Calumet City. They estimate to have saved over 40,000 babies and their mothers from abortion since opening in 1984.
