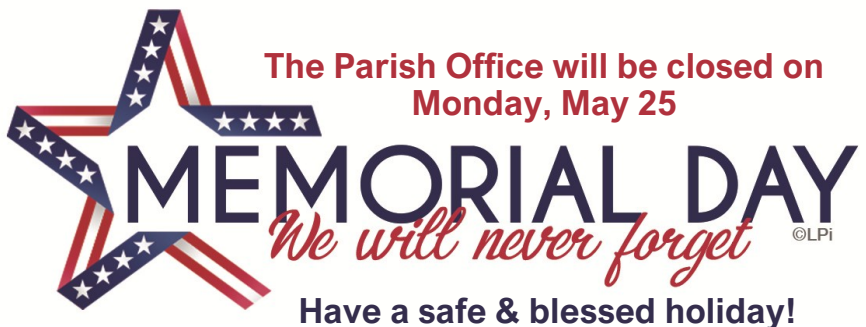

PENTECOST SUNDAY: Make Us Bold Witnesses of Christ

This is the day when, true to his promise, Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to the apostles. The coming of the Spirit changed the apostles and saw the launching of a new community: the Church. This day renews the gift of the Spirit in each of us and in the Church as a whole. Jesus' gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost is not just a beautiful event from the past. It is the living power of God among us today, giving us courage, unity, peace, forgiveness, and the gifts we need to build up the Church. The readings show that the Spirit changes fearful disciples into bold witnesses, and they show us how to live as Spirit-filled Christians in everyday life.

In the Gospel, the disciples are locked behind closed doors because they are afraid. Then Jesus comes among them and says, "Peace be with you." He breathes on them and gives them the Holy Spirit. That moment tells us something very important: the Holy Spirit is not only for special moments in church. The Spirit comes to meet us in our fear, anxiety, confusion, and weakness.

Many people today live behind the closed doors of their own hearts. Some are locked in fear about the future. Some are trapped in anger, sadness, guilt, loneliness, or discouragement. Some are afraid to speak about their faith. Pentecost reminds us that Jesus enters those locked places and brings peace. The Holy Spirit gives us the strength to open the doors of our lives and move forward with trust.

In the First Reading (Acts 2:1-11), people from many different nations hear the apostles speaking in their own languages. This is the miracle of Pentecost: not that everyone becomes the same, but that everyone understands the one message of God's love. The Holy Spirit does not erase differences. Instead, the Spirit brings unity amid diversity.

That is also what St. Paul teaches in the second reading (1Cor: 12:3b-7,12-13). There are many gifts, but one Spirit. There are many members, but one Body. This means that in the Church, no one is useless and no one has all the gifts. Some serve quietly. Some teach. Some encourage. Some organize. Some pray. Some care for the sick, the children, the lonely, and the poor. Every gift matters because each comes from the same Spirit and is given for the good of all.

In daily life, this means we must stop comparing ourselves to others. We do not need to be the same to belong to Christ. The Spirit calls each of us to use our own gifts faithfully. A family becomes stronger when each member serves with love. A parish becomes more alive when every person contributes. A community becomes more peaceful when people respect differences and seek understanding and use their gifts to serve others.



It is not just as a bishop or priest that the Spirit calls people to ministry, and I'm afraid I would bore everyone if I tried to mention all the ways the Spirit inspires people to serve God in this Parish and the larger community, either paid or as volunteers. If I did try to name all the different ways people serve, I know I would forget to name some of those ways and then someone would feel unappreciated. You know who you are and can pat yourself on the back. I am convinced that everyone who come here to All Souls Parish/St. Ann Church is always here because they have been moved by the Holy Spirit to be here. Paul said, "No one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit." (1 Cor. 12:3) The Holy Spirit helps us to believe.

Two closing thoughts: I have often asked people if they belong to any faith, whether they have any religion. They often answer, "We don't believe in organized religion, but we are spiritual people." I never push, but I often wonder what "spiritual" means to them. Anyone who believes in God is spiritual in some sense, whether they are pagans, or Hindus, or Buddhists, or Muslims. Even radical Muslims who do terrible things in the name of Allah consider themselves spiritual people. Even demons are spiritual because that's what they are made of, spirit. Being spiritual says nothing special about us. What matters is whether we let God's Holy Spirit lead us, God's Holy Spirit who connects us with the Father and with Jesus, and who connects us with the community of believers in Christ.

My last comment: When I first came here to St. Ann Church from 2007 through 2009, I used to speak to parents of children who were preparing for the sacrament of Confirmation. (I was assigned as the Director of Religious Education & Associate Pastor then) I always reminded them of the fruits of the Holy Spirit as identified by St. Paul. His list begins with love (not just any kind of love, but a generous, giving kind of love). He goes on to mention joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. I always encouraged them to help prepare their children for this sacrament so their children would be abundantly blessed with these qualities. I would ask them if they would like to see more of these virtues in their children. Now I ask you, wouldn't you like to have more of these virtues in yourself?

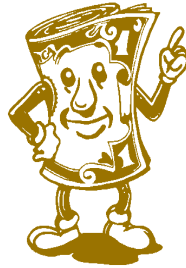
On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came with power, peace, and fire. That same Spirit still comes to us today. The Spirit gives us courage when we are afraid, unity when we are divided, gifts when we feel unworthy, and forgiveness when we are broken. So let us pray today: Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful. Fill our homes, our parish, our families, and our hearts. Make us bold witnesses of Christ, loving members of his Body, and instruments of peace in the world. Amen.

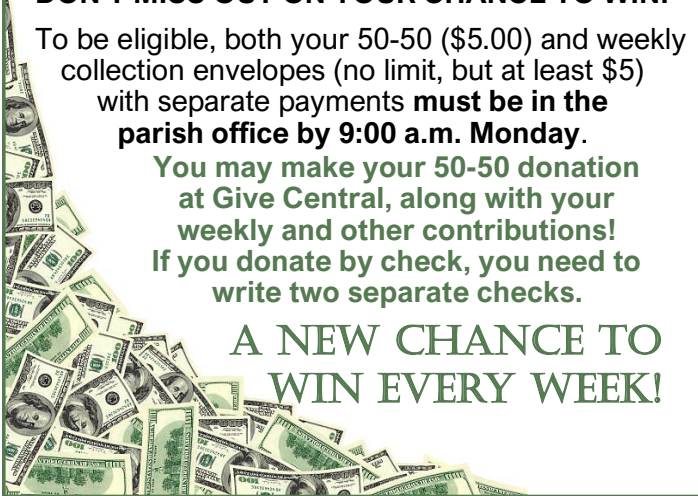

All Souls will again participate in the Baby Bottle Project to benefit the Women's Centers of Greater Chicagoland, a non-profit organization that assists mothers and families experiencing crisis pregnancies by offering emotional, financial, material, and spiritual support through counseling, clothing and monetary provisions, prayer, and other aid. Each year, the Women's Center sees over 5,000 expectant mothers in their three locations, one of which is located at Our Lady of Knock in Calumet City. They estimate to have saved over 40,000 babies and their mothers from abortion since opening in 1984.
