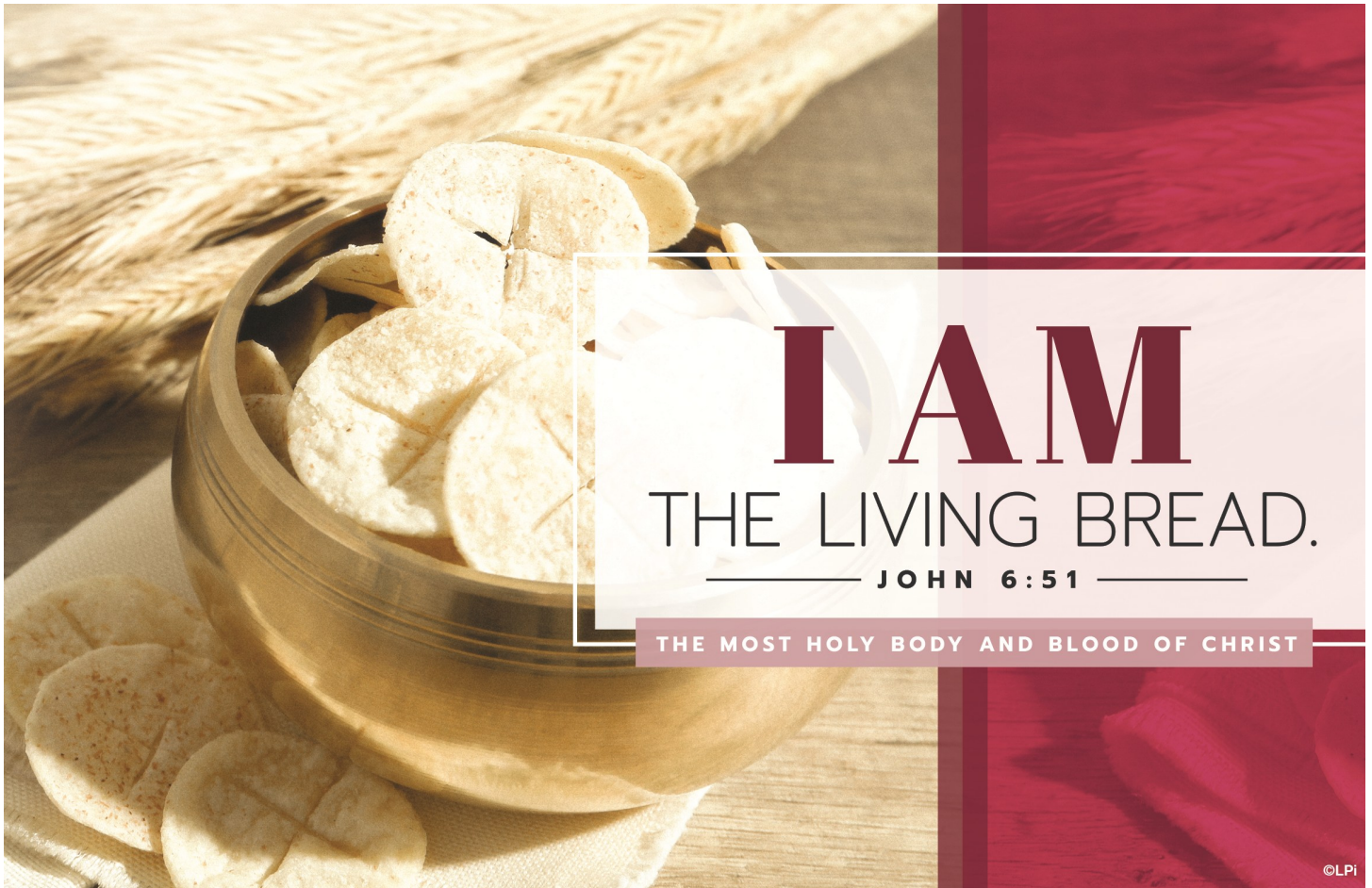

MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST: Corpus Christi

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. It is a feast centered on one of the greatest gifts we have ever received, the Eucharist. As Christian stewards, we recognize that all we are and all we have come from God. Among His greatest gifts is His own Son, given to us in the Eucharist as true spiritual nourishment. Today's readings show us three great truths about the Eucharist. First, God feeds His people. Second, Christ offers Himself as the true sacrifice. Third, the Eucharist sends us to live a life of communion, love, and service.

In the first reading (Dt 8:14), we hear how Melchizedek brings out bread and wine and blesses Abram. This is a beautiful sign pointing forward to Christ. Long before the Last Supper, God was already preparing His people to understand that bread and wine could become a sacred sign of blessing and covenant. In the Eucharist, Jesus takes what is simple and ordinary and makes it holy. He gives us His very self under the forms of bread and wine.

In the second reading (1 Cor 10:17), Saint Paul reminds us of the words of Jesus at the Last Supper: "This is my body... this cup is the new covenant in my blood." Paul is not speaking about a symbol only. He is handing on the living mystery of the Lord's death and resurrection made present in every Mass. The Eucharist is the sacrifice of Christ, offered once for all, and made present to us so that we may share in its saving power.

Then, in the Gospel (Jn 6:51), Jesus multiplies the loaves and fishes. The crowd is hungry, and the disciples want to send them away. But Jesus says, "Give them some food yourselves." He takes, blesses, breaks, and gives. These same actions appear at every Mass. Jesus still feeds His people. He still gathers the hungry. He still works through human hands to provide nourishment for body and soul. This is

not only a miracle of provision, but a powerful image of the stewardship way of life. When we offer our gifts to the Lord, no matter how small they may seem, He receives them, blesses them, and uses them to accomplish far more than we could ever imagine. We come to Mass with faith and reverence.

The Eucharist is not routine. It is the living presence of Jesus among His people. We receive Holy Communion with gratitude and humility. We do not deserve this gift, yet Christ gives Himself freely in love. We become what we receive. If we receive the Body of Christ, then we must live as the Body of Christ:



united, forgiving, generous, and compassionate. We should share bread with others. Sometimes not only the physical bread, but ideas or our physical presence to those who are lonely, for example. The Eucharist must lead us to charity. No one who receives Christ can remain indifferent to the poor, the lonely, the sick, or the forgotten.

We bring Christ into our homes, families, and workplaces. Corpus Christi is lived when our words, actions, and choices reflect the presence of Jesus in us. We adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. We should take time before the tabernacle. Eucharistic adoration deepens our love and strengthens our faith. Corpus Christi reminds us that Jesus is not far away. He remains with us in the Eucharist, feeding us with His own life. The same Lord who broke the bread for the crowd now breaks Himself for us at every Mass. May we receive Him with love, adore Him with faith, and live so that others may recognize in us the presence of Christ.

Moses told God's people not to forget what God had done for them. Today's feast inspires us not to forget what Jesus does and continues to do for us through the Eucharist. Amen.

Gospel Reading

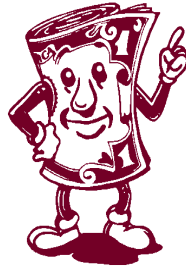

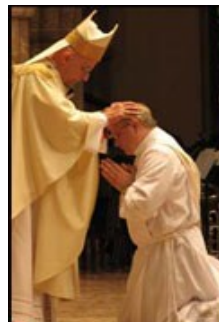

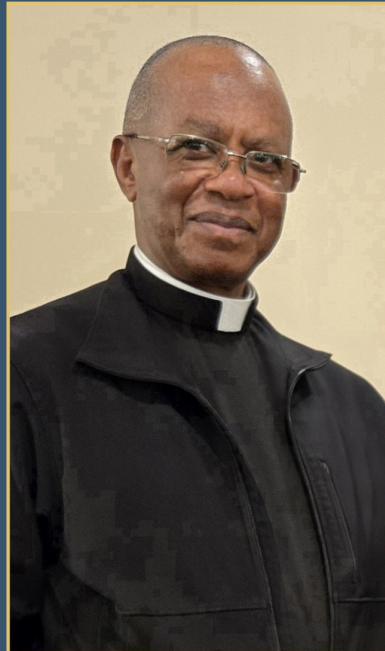

May 9-10 Through June 20-21

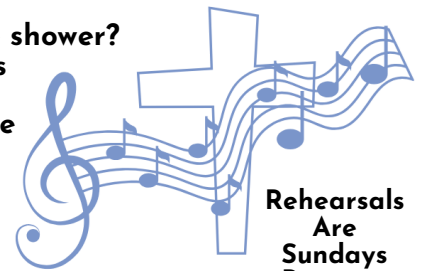

Each year, the Women's Center sees over 5,000 expectant mothers in their three locations, one of which is located at Our Lady of Knock in Calumet City. They estimate to have saved over 40,000 babies and their mothers from abortion since opening in 1984.
