TWELFTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME: Witnessing in Spite of Fear

First and foremost, fear and courage are not mutually exclusive. They can and do coexist. Courage does not mean never being afraid. Courage is being afraid and overcoming it, or carrying on in spite of it. Pope John Paul II had as his motto: "Be not afraid." Of course, he was quoting our Lord whom we just heard give the same mandate to His apostles in today's Gospel, "Do not be afraid."

It is normal and natural that courage will sometimes fail us and that we will be afraid. All those who have accomplished great things have known fear at one time or another. We think of the prophet Jeremiah in our first reading, of Martin Luther King, and of Jesus himself in the garden of Gethsemane.

Fear is not necessarily a bad thing. Fear sometimes has a protective function, warning us of the presence of danger. In this case, fear is a grace. Nevertheless, fear can be a handicap. It can paralyze a person. It can turn a person into a coward.

God's Word today speaks against fear and favoritism and calls us to trust that nothing—no rumor, no threat, no hatred—can finally silence God's love in our lives. Jeremiah bears persecution with a steady hope; Paul teaches that God's gift in Christ overcomes the power of sin; and Jesus urges us to be fearless, because God knows and keeps us. Let's see how these readings can become real, daily living for us.

In the first reading this weekend (Jer 20:10-13), Jeremiah says, "The Lord is with me... I will sing to the Lord." Even when people laugh at him and plot against him, he doesn't deny the pain—he names the threat, and then he anchors himself in God.

In the letter to the Romans (Rom 5:12-15), St. Paul teaches that sin entered the world, but he also makes it clear that God's grace enters further. There is a difference between what sin did and what God's gift does. Where sin spreads through one, God's kindness spreads through Christ—because grace is stronger than condemnation.

Then in the Gospel (Mt 10:26-33), Jesus tells His disciples: do not be afraid of those who can only destroy the body. God's care reaches deeper than what people can see or do. God "numbers" our lives, and the truth is this: we belong to God. So, we can confess Christ publicly, even when it costs us something, and we can live with courage when gossip tries to shame us.

Here are a few practical steps we can take this week to live out these readings:

- From Jeremiah we learn that when people pressure or ridicule you, one should choose worship over fear. The moment someone mocks your faith, pray silently for strength and respond with calm honesty rather than anger. If you feel discouraged after conflict, take one "Jeremiah minute." Speak one sentence to God, like "The Lord is with me," and then act from that steadiness.



- From the letter to the Romans, we can learn that when guilt or "I'm not good enough" attacks you, let grace speak louder. Replace self-hatred with a concrete act of renewal: go to confession or decide today on one small good deed you will do faithfully. Before you judge yourself or others, remember grace is a gift that overcomes what sin causes.

- In Matthew's Gospel, the practical lesson we can take this weekend is this: Pray before you speak. Ask God for the right words to stand for truth without becoming harsh. Do one visible

act of Christian love each day: help someone quietly, forgive a small offense, or speak well of someone who's being talked about.

Today we don't deny threats—we entrust ourselves to God because, where fear tries to control us, Christ's gift gives us courage, peace, and a life that can't be silenced. May the Lord place in our hearts the same trust Jeremiah had, the same confidence Paul proclaims, and the same fearless love Jesus commands. Let us live the Gospel not only at Mass, but in work, family, and every quiet decision of the day. Amen.

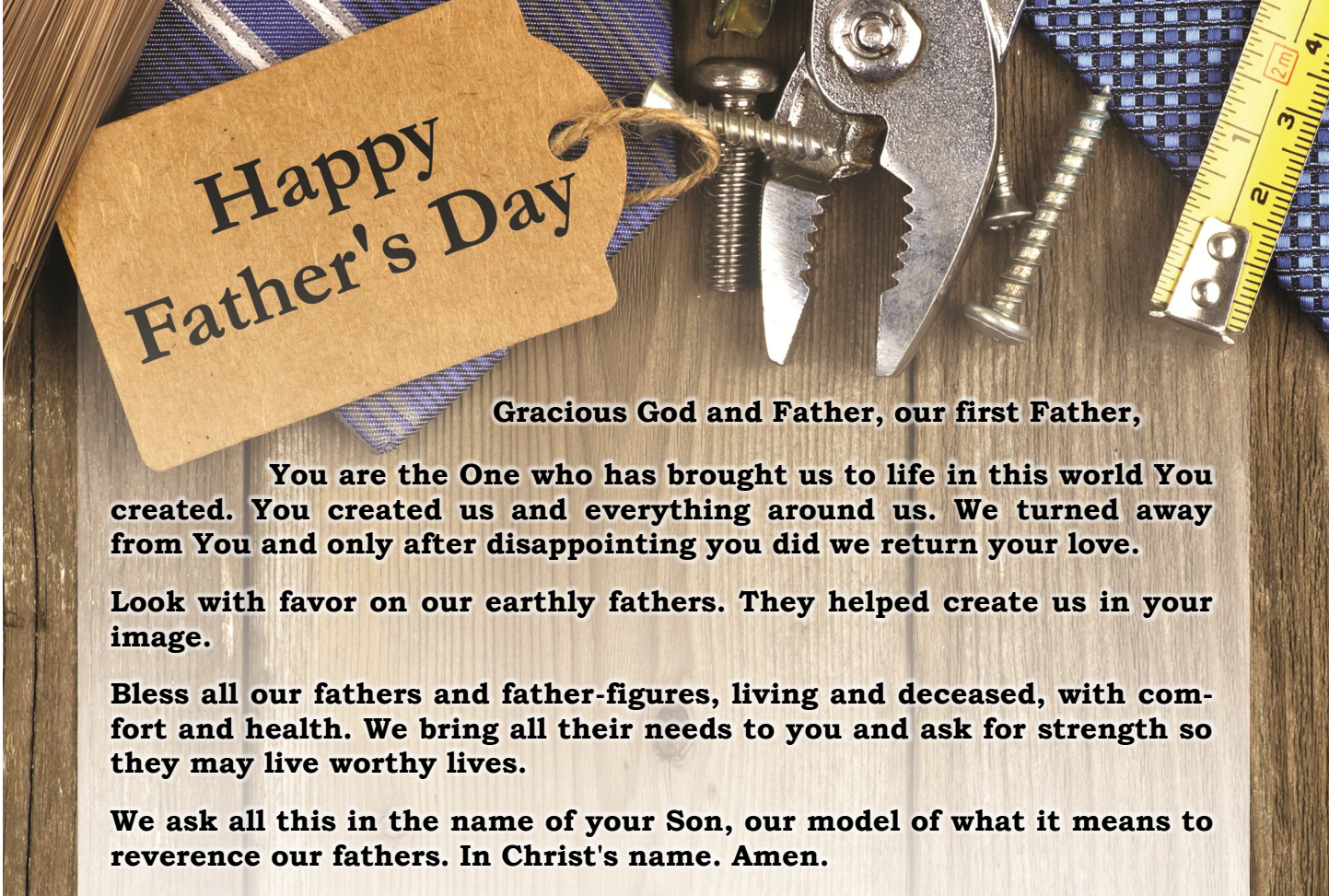

WAVE CONCLUSION

All Souls recently concluded the Generation to Generation: Answer the Call campaign. Our parish successfully completed the campaign by raising **\$674,245** or **127% of our initial \$530,000 goal**. That was accomplished by 140 pledges. We could not have done it without the generosity of our faithful parishioners and dedicated volunteers.

The funds raised through the campaign will support the following initiatives at All Souls:

OUR PRIORITIES

- **Priority 1: Creating an accessible campus**

To ensure all parishioners can participate in parish life, we will repair or replace the elevator in the former school building and improve ADA accessibility in restrooms and entryways.

- **Priority 2: Strengthening parish spaces**

We will also install air conditioning in the former school building to make our parish spaces more marketable to potential tenants and comfortable year-round.

- **Priority 3: Spiritual renewal of our parish through ministries**

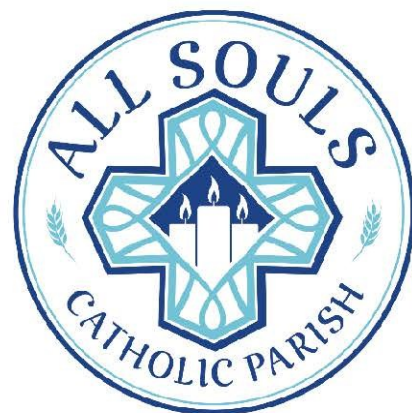
Campaign funds will also invest in Alpha programs, youth ministry events, and other opportunities for spiritual renewal at our parish.

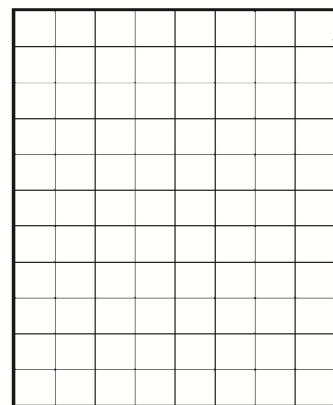
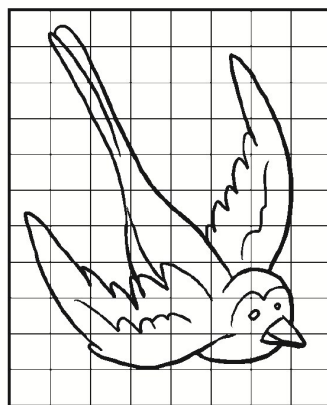

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

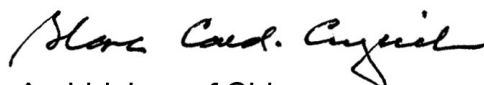
When Catholics come together and reminisce about the past, inevitably they recall the priests of their parishes.
