THE THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The readings for this Sunday all speak with one voice: God does not only call us to believe, He calls us to belong to Him—and then to show that belonging in concrete, daily acts of love. The Word of God today moves from a gracious home in the Old Testament, to baptismal life in the letter to the Romans, and finally to practical discipleship in the Gospel. In the end, we see that faith is tested and proved in how we receive others, especially in small and costly ways.

In the first reading (2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16a), we meet a woman in Shunem who is not famous, not powerful, and not seeking attention. She is simply faithful and discerning. She notices the man of God; Elisha and she chooses to treat him as a person worthy of honor. She invites him in, offers him a place to stay, and even prepares a room for him to rest. When we look at this first reading, we may not have Elisha in our street, but we have God's messengers all around us. Today's "home" can be our kitchen, our parish hall, our workplace, and even our social media spaces. The question after we read today's first reading is: How do we treat the people God puts in front of us?

- Receive people with dignity. Not only those who are easy to love, but also those who are struggling, demanding, or different.
- Make room for God's servants. That can mean helping with parish needs, supporting priests and catechists, and encouraging missionaries and those who work for the Gospel.
- Give a stable place of support. The Shunem woman prepared a room—something steady. In daily life, that can mean being consistent: consistent prayer, consistent forgiveness, consistent availability when someone needs help.
- Trust that God sees hidden generosity. Many good deeds are unseen by humans but not unseen by God.

In our second reading (Romans 6:3-4, 8-11), St. Paul moves us from hospitality to identity. He teaches that we were baptized into Christ's death and resurrection. Baptism is not a ritual that ends when the water dries. Baptism is a new life poured into us, life in Christ. Daily Christian living is baptism made visible. Baptism becomes real when our choices start to reflect our belonging. How can we live our baptism life?

- Put sin to death but putting goodness into action. Baptism means a new direction. It means breaking old patterns, like anger that keeps returning, dishonesty that "everyone does," habits that quietly harden the heart.
- Live with resurrection thinking. When we face failure, we do not only say, "I messed up." We repent, rise again, and keep walking.
- Let prayer become a daily "resurrection routine." Even when you feel dry, you return to God. That returning is resurrection life.
- Refuse to live only for comfort. Baptism unites us with Christ who served. If we truly share Christ's life, we will share His concern for others.



In Matthew's Gospel this weekend (MT 10:37-42), Our Lord Himself proclaims this same instruction in a rather shocking way: "Whoever loves father or mother... son or daughter more than Me is not worthy of Me." And "Whoever finds his life (by living for oneself) will lose it, and whoever loses his life for My sake will find it." How can an all-loving Lord say such things? Precisely because He is the source of all love. He is love incarnate. We can only love others, and even ourselves truly, if we allow ourselves to be emptied of self-love and filled with God's love. This is why our Lord tells us we must "lose our lives." Putting

ourselves or even those dearest to us above God simply cannot give us the ultimate fulfillment and peace of soul that we all want. Only God can do that. Only loving God first and living for Christ, "losing our life," can do that.

But how do we know if we love God more than "father or mother or son or daughter"? Jesus tells us in the next verses. And the fascinating genius of it all is that it is precisely through loving actions towards others, loving them as if they were Christ, that we demonstrate our love for Christ! "Whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple... he will surely not lose his reward."

So, we have come full circle to the importance of hospitality, and to putting God first in our lives because we have become disciples of Christ through our Baptism. We put God first by serving others as if we were serving Christ Himself, thus losing a self-centered life and finding our true fulfillment. Amen.

Paul teaches the Romans that as believers, we have died and risen in Christ and now look forward to living in "newness of life." Is there something you are really looking forward to?

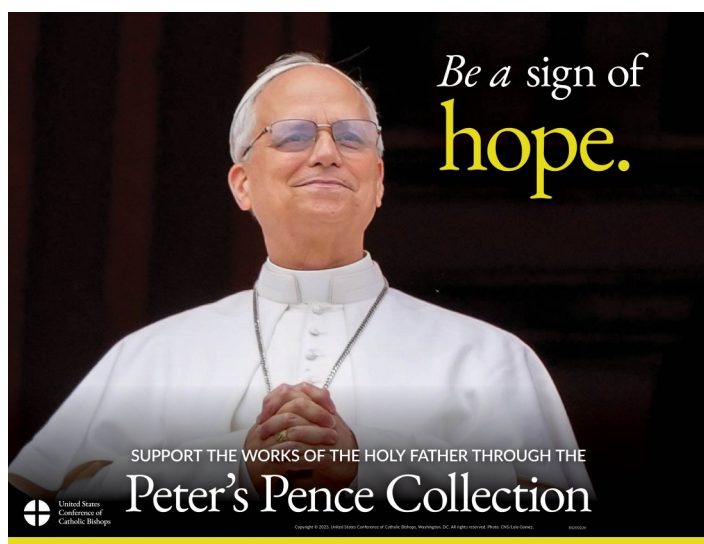

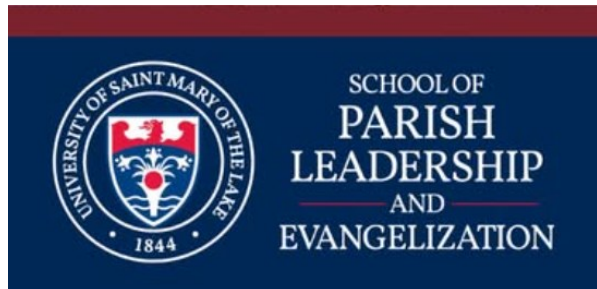

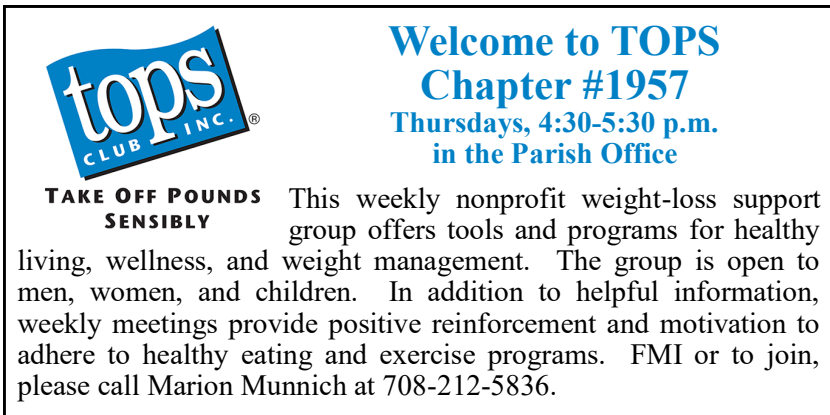
