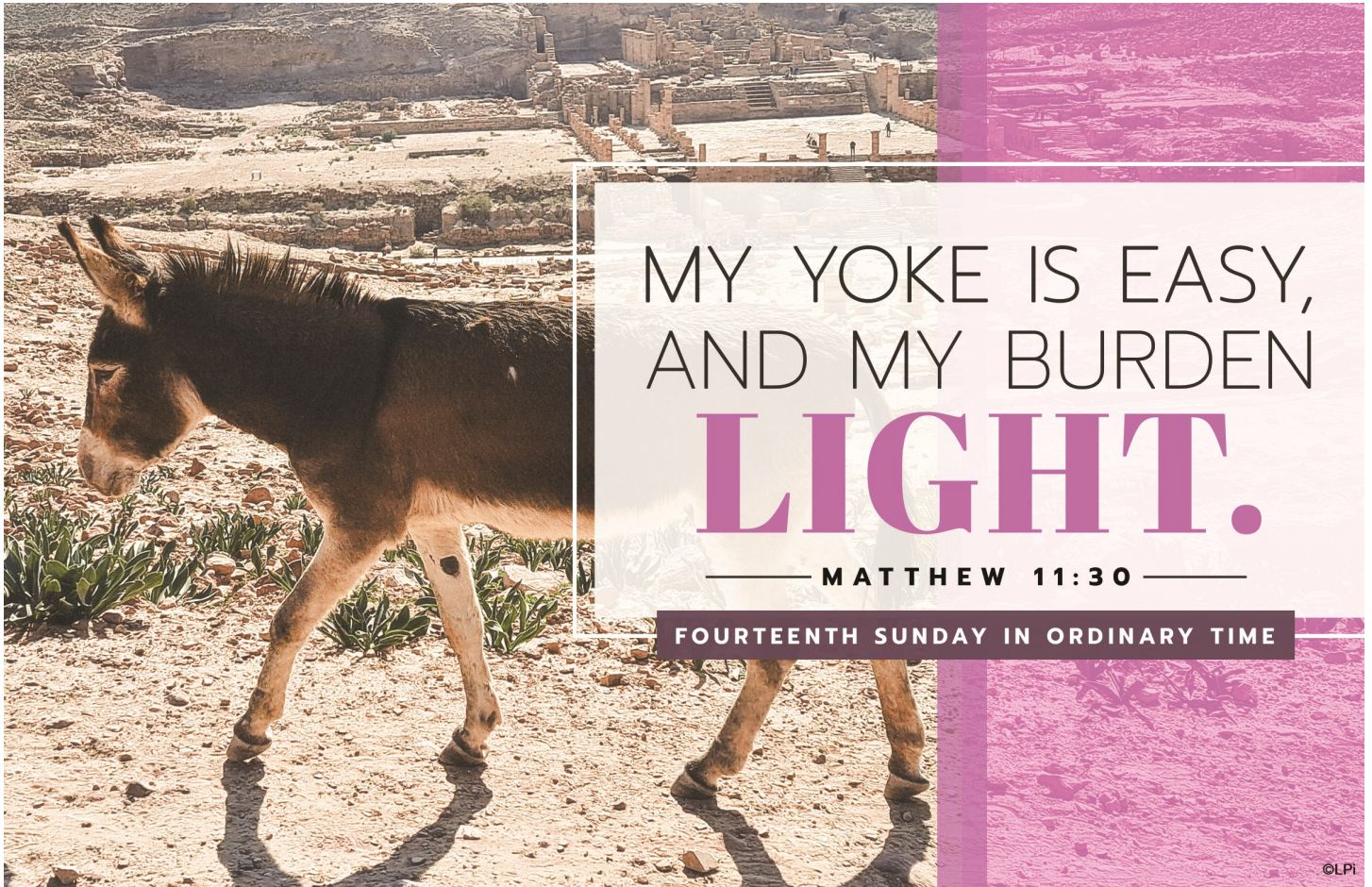

FOURTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME: Come to Me All You Who Labor

A man came home from a long day of counting ballots at the Board of Elections in his area. He said to his wife, "We won, dear. I'm now a state representative." Not sure she heard correctly, she said "Honestly!" He said in reply, "Now don't bring anything up about honesty!"

Some of you may have heard this true story. It was at a graduation ceremony at the University of Maryland a few years ago. The graduates marched in with great solemnity. Parents were smiling and brushing away tears at the same time. The speakers appropriately stayed within the guidelines of political correctness, and no one dared ask for divine blessings on the graduates or their families. The final speaker, one of the students, went to the podium, he stood there silently for a few moments then, without a cue, every one of the graduates sneezed. The student at the podium looked at the audience and said, "God bless you, each and every one of you." And he walked off the stage. The audience exploded into applause.

So, on this July 4th holiday weekend, I say God bless each and every one of you. We know our country is not perfect, nor are all its politicians, but it's the best country on the face of the earth. Just the fact that we can go to church freely whenever we want, is one indication of that freedom. In some countries our lives would be threatened, or we would be put in jail just for doing what we're doing. Let us continue to work and pray that we might remain strong, able to stand on our own, and remain free—not to do just anything we feel like, but free to serve God and to serve each other in love.

Jesus invites us to come to Him when life feels heavy and when the heart feels tired. In this weekend's reflection, we look at the prophecies of Zechariah in the first reading, the encouragement of Saint Paul in the second reading, and the gentle authority of Jesus in the Gospel. Together, these readings show that God's strength is not harsh pressure it is a Father's embrace that reforms the way we live. All our readings this weekend return us to one core truth: God comes to His people not with domination, but with mercy, and He calls us to live in a new way under His Spirit, with a heart that rests in Him.

In the first reading (Zec 9:9-10), the prophet Zechariah proclaims that the coming King is different from the kings people often expect. He is described as just and bringing salvation, yet He is also humble riding on a donkey, not on a warhorse. He will proclaim peace to the nations. And this King's rule is not meant to frighten you into submission; it is meant to save you into peace. That's an important foundation for today. Sometimes, when life becomes difficult, we imagine God as a judge who only waits to catch us. But Zechariah shows a King who comes with salvation and peace—meaning God's purpose is restoration, not destruction. So if you are weighed down today by fear, regret, or burdens you can't set down, God is not only aware of them, He has already come with His peace.

In the second reading (Rom 8:9, 11-13), St. Paul makes the question personal. He tells the Romans that they are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, and that the Spirit of God dwells in them. He goes further: if the Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, then Christ will also give life to your mortal bodies

through the Spirit. Paul also says something very practical: we must not live according to the flesh. If we live according to the flesh, we will die; but if by the Spirit we put to death the deeds of the body, we will live. This is not simply about obeying rules. It is about letting the Holy Spirit reshape our direction. Paul is describing a spiritual reality: your life is either driven by the flesh meaning selfishness, control, and destructive patterns or driven by the Spirit meaning love, truth, self-giving, and a new way of thinking and acting. And at Mass, the Church is always doing this same work: bringing us out of old habits and into the life of Christ.

In the Gospel this weekend (Mt 11:29), Jesus says, "Come to Me." "Come" is the word I want to stress here. He has already come to us, through His birth, His teachings and miracles, His death and resurrection, through grace and the sacraments. He has come as far as possible. Coming to Him implies we have to move closer, we have more to learn from Him. We must take time to pray, to read the Scriptures, to forgive those who have hurt us, to be kind to others, and all the other things we've been taught about living a life of holiness. Don't expect that Jesus is going to make us rich and take all our problems away. He did promise a cross to those who follow him. Life itself, however, has many crosses, whether we follow Jesus or not. It's a lot easier when we have Jesus as part of our everyday lives. "My yoke is easy and my burden light." "Come to me all you who labor and are burdened."



So, how can we live this weekend's readings today?

- When we feel overwhelmed, we don't only try harder. We come to Christ prayerfully, honestly, and repeatedly because His peace is not theoretical, it is offered.
- When we notice old patterns—anger that flares, fear that controls, selfishness that hardens—we choose the Spirit. That means cooperation with grace: small acts of self-denial for the sake of love.
- When we feel "too small" to approach God, Jesus' words correct that instinct. The Father reveals His ways to little ones, to those who admit need.

And there's one more key point: Jesus doesn't call us merely to comfort; He calls us to learn. His invitation leads to transformation. Today Zechariah shows us a King of peace who comes with humility. Paul shows us that the Spirit truly gives life and calls us away from destructive living. Jesus, in the Gospel, invites the weary to come and find rest in Him, rest that carries us through the burdens of life. So, as we celebrate this Mass, let us ask for the grace to believe that God's yoke is light because it is His yoke. Let us ask for the Spirit to live within us more fully. And let us come to Jesus, especially when our hearts are tired, so that His peace can become real in our thoughts, our choices, and our relationships.

May Christ, the gentle King, give us rest and make us people who walk by the Spirit, to the glory of God the Father, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

SCAM ALERT

You will NEVER receive an email from Fr. Mark or anyone on staff asking for you to send gift cards or bank information or to rescue us from any dire situations. If you receive an email "from" Fr. Mark saying, "I need your help, please email me back," or "I can't talk, I'm in a meeting," something like that, rest assured, it is NOT from him. Definitely do not purchase any gift cards and send the codes to this bogus correspondent! Hover over the name of the sender so that you can see the email address from which it came. It will likely be something random or generic like pastor1234@gmail.com, or the latest one we've seen going around: revdsrectory@gmail.com. It's very easy for people to create these fake email addresses and impersonate someone you trust. Please don't fall for it! If you ever have a question, simply call the office at 708-895-6700 so we can clear it up.

What is EUCHARISTIC ADORATION and why is it important?

- Eucharistic adoration is a way to deepen one's personal relationship with Jesus Christ by spending time in prayer and adoration before the exposed Eucharist.
- It allows for a more intimate experience of Jesus' presence than is possible during Mass.
- It is a source of peace, comfort, and spiritual renewal, and also an opportunity to express love, gratitude, and adoration to Jesus.
- There are no strict rules about what to do during adoration, but it is a time for quiet reflection and prayer. Some might pray the rosary, meditate on scripture, read spiritual books, or simply sit in silence.



The key is to focus on the presence of Jesus and allow oneself to be near Him.

Did you know that we have EUCHARISTIC ADORATION in the St. Ann Day Chapel every Monday and Thursday from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.?

When the Eucharist is exposed, it should not be left unattended. Would you be willing to take an hour-long shift watching over the Eucharist?
