SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY

TIME: Wisdom

The readings for this weekend invite us to recognize that the greatest treasure in life is not wealth, success, or comfort, but a heart that knows God and chooses His Kingdom above all else. Solomon asks for wisdom; Saint Paul assures us that God works for good in those who love Him; and Jesus teaches that the Kingdom is worth everything we have.

A woman found a lamp, and as she examined it out popped a genie. "Do I get three wishes?" she asked. "Nope, I'm a one-wish genie. What will it be?" She pulled out a map and said, "See this map? I want these countries to stop fighting so we can have world peace." "They've been fighting for many centuries," he replied. "I'm not that good. What else do you have?" the genie asked the lady. "Well, I'd like a good man. One who's considerate, loves kids, is filthy rich, likes to cook, and doesn't watch sports all day." "Okay," the genie said with a sigh. "Let me see that map again."



What would we ask for if God or a one-wish genie appeared to us? When Solomon asked for wisdom, it showed he was already wise. Unfortunately, he didn't keep using his wisdom to serve God's people well. He married too many wives and spent the country into bankruptcy, so much so that when he died, the country split into two kingdoms, pretty much isolating the kings who were descendants of David and Solomon. I felt I needed to add that part about Solomon, because having wisdom does not mean we will always make good use of it. Let us return now to today's Gospel.

In the Gospel, Jesus gives us two short parables. One man finds treasure hidden in a field; another finds a pearl of great price. Both sell everything to possess what they have found. Jesus is telling us that the Kingdom of God, friendship with Christ, eternal life, and the grace of salvation are worth more than anything else. The question is: What is our treasure? What are we giving our best time, energy, attention, and love to? Many things in life are good: family, work, rest, friendships, and material security. But none of them can take the place of God. When Christ becomes our treasure, everything else finds its proper place. We do not lose what is good; rather, we learn to receive it with gratitude and use it according to God's will.

This is the third consecutive week we have heard parables about the Kingdom of Heaven. What would we be willing to spend all our money on, like the people in today's Gospel? We may think the parables of the treasure and the pearl need no explanation. Certainly, Heaven will be all that we could ever desire and more so. But there is a subtle message here that we must not miss. Notice the people who discovered the treasure and the pearl made it their highest priority. Nothing else was more important. Our search for the kingdom of God must be our highest priority. Everything we have or might attain in life will give us some satisfaction and happiness, but everything is temporary. Jesus has revealed to us that entering

into the Kingdom of Heaven is happiness forever. What could be more important than that?

In the first reading, God appears to Solomon and says, "Ask something of me and I will give it to you." Solomon could have asked for riches, long life, victory over enemies, or power. Instead, he asks for wisdom: "Give your servant an understanding heart." He knows that he cannot lead God's people by his own strength. He needs the mind and heart of God. That is a beautiful prayer for every one of us. We face many decisions: how to raise our children, how to care for aging parents, how to use money, how to deal with conflict, how to respond when we are hurt, and how to remain faithful when life is difficult. We may often only ask God to remove our problems. But Solomon teaches us to ask first, "Lord, give me wisdom. Help me to see as You see. Help me to choose what is right, loving, and faithful."

Saint Paul gives us great hope. "We know that all things work for good for those who love God." This does not mean that every event is good. Suffering, sickness, injustice, betrayal, and loss are not good in themselves. But God is powerful enough to bring grace even from painful situations. When we remain close to Him, He can turn our wounds into compassion, our failures into humility, and our trials into deeper faith.

The Kingdom of Heaven is like a net cast into the sea which catches all kinds of fish. When it is full, the fisherman hauls it ashore. Then he sits down and sorts out the good fish from the bad. The good he keeps, the worthless he throws away. In a sense, all of us are fishers. Each day we cast our net into the sea of life. And at the end of the day we have a catch, sometimes small, sometimes large. May we take time to sift through that catch. And may you, Lord, give us the wisdom to know what to keep and what to throw away. How can we live the message of Scripture this week?

- Begin each day with Solomon's prayer: "Lord, give me a wise and understanding heart."
- Before an important decision, pause and ask: "Will this choice bring me closer to Christ and His Kingdom?"
- Make time each day for prayer, Scripture, or quiet before the Blessed Sacrament, treating your relationship with God as your greatest treasure.
- In a difficult moment, say: "Lord, I do not understand this fully, but I trust that You can bring good from it."
- Choose one concrete act that puts the Kingdom first: forgive someone, help a neighbor, reconcile with a family member, attend Mass faithfully, or give generously to someone in need.

May the Lord give us the wisdom of Solomon, the trust of Saint Paul, and the courage to value the Kingdom above all else. When Christ is our treasure, we discover that we have found the one thing that truly lasts. Amen.

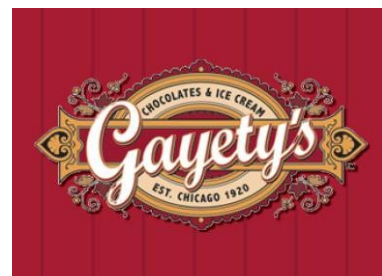

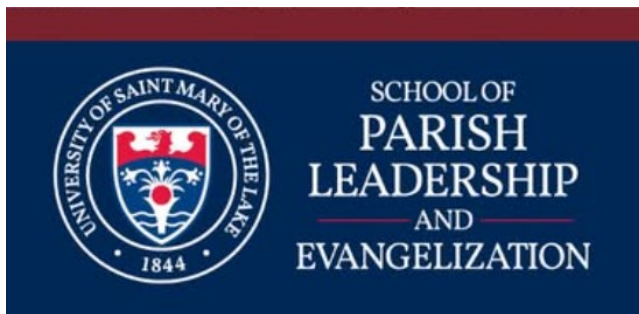
