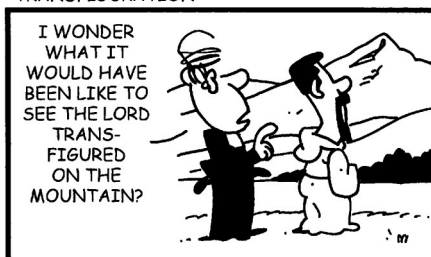

EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Feeding the Hungry

The readings this weekend invite us to bring our deepest hunger to God, to trust that nothing can separate us from Christ's love, and to become generous instruments through whom Jesus feeds others. God does not ask us to provide what we do not have; He asks us to place what we have in His hands.

In the miracle of the loaves and fishes, in the gospel, we cannot get back to what actually happened. But we can see what it meant to Matthew and his readers. For them, the miracle recalled the Old Testament story of manna in the desert. Jesus is the new Moses who feeds his people in the desert. In this feeding, they saw an anticipation of the Eucharist. The gestures and words used are those of the Last Supper and of the Eucharist: "He took the bread ...blessed it... broke it ... and gave it to them." The Eucharist in turn anticipates the final banquet of the Kingdom.

Sisters and brothers, today's readings speak to a hunger that all of us know. We hunger for food, certainly, but also for peace, meaning, forgiveness, love, security, and hope. Many people try to satisfy these deeper hungers with things that cannot last: money, entertainment, success, possessions, or the approval of others. Yet the heart remains restless when it is separated from God.

In the first reading (Is, 55:1-3), the prophet Isaiah speaks God's invitation. "All you who are thirsty, come to the water." God invites those who have nothing to come and receive freely. "Come, receive grain and eat; come, without paying and without cost." This is the generosity of God. His mercy is not for sale. His love is not reserved for the successful or the perfect. He welcomes the poor, the weary, the sinner, the confused, and the discouraged. God then asks a searching question: Why spend your money for what is not bread, and your wages for what fails to satisfy? That question reaches into our daily lives. To what are we giving our time, energy, and attention? Are we feeding our souls with prayer, the Scriptures, the Eucharist, and acts of love? Or are we filling our hearts with things that leave us emptier than before?

The Gospel (Mt. 14:13-21) shows us Jesus looking with compassion on the crowd. He had gone apart after hearing of the death of his cousin John the Baptist, yet when the people followed Him, He did not turn them away. He saw their need. He healed their sick. As evening came, the disciples saw only a problem: a large crowd, a remote place, and very little food. Their solution was simple: "Send them away." But Jesus says something astonishing. "There is no need for them to go away; give them some food yourselves." The disciples answer, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have here." They see scarcity. Jesus sees an offering that can be blessed.

How often do we say the same thing? "I do not have enough time." "I do not have enough patience." "I do not

have enough money." "I do not know what to say." "Someone else can help." Yet Jesus says to us, "Bring them here to me." Bring your five loaves and two fish: your small faith, your limited strength, your imperfect kindness, your few minutes for someone who is lonely, your willingness to forgive, your simple prayer. Jesus takes the loaves, looks to heaven, blesses them, breaks them, and gives them to the disciples to distribute. Everyone eats, and there is more than enough. The miracle teaches us that in the hands of Christ, little becomes enough. What we offer with love, Jesus can multiply beyond what we imagine.

This Gospel also points us toward the Holy Eucharist. Jesus takes, blesses, breaks, and gives. At every Mass, He feeds us not merely with bread but with Himself. He is the Bread of Life who satisfies the deepest hunger of the human heart. We come to Him empty-handed, and He fills us with His mercy, strength, and presence.

In the second reading, St. Paul (Rom. 8:35, 37-39) gives us the foundation for this trust. He asks, "What will separate us from the love of Christ?" Will anguish, distress, persecution, hunger, danger, or hardship? Then he answers with confidence, "In all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through Him who loved us." Paul does not say that Christians will never suffer. He knew hardship, rejection, danger, and loss. But he knew something even greater: nothing—not suffering, not failure, not fear, not even death—can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus. When you are anxious about your family, remember, nothing can separate you from Christ's love. When you are carrying grief, illness, financial stress, or loneliness, remember nothing can separate you from Christ's love. When you feel you have little to offer, bring it to Jesus. He receives it, blesses it, and uses it for good.

Paul himself experienced lots of troubles. In his second letter to the Corinthians, he enumerates some of these troubles. He was imprisoned and whipped, almost to the point of death. Three times he was beaten with sticks. Once he was stoned by a mob and left for dead. Three times he was shipwrecked and spent a day and a night adrift in the open sea. He travelled thousands of miles on foot, often narrowly escaping death at the hands of robbers or enemies. He knew hunger and thirst, cold and nakedness, to say nothing about the burden of worry and concern he carried because of his love for all the Churches. Yet he says that he was able to overcome all these things through the power of God who loved him. When he says that nothing can come between us and the love of God, he is talking out of experience.

Life is unpredictable. We can't depend on human things. We can be happy one day and sad the next, healthy one day and sick the next, successful one day and a failure the next. So, who is there to hold on to? Who is there to trust at all times? Only God. Only God can give us what we are looking for. The sense of having a love that is trustworthy, something that never changes, something that no one can take from us.

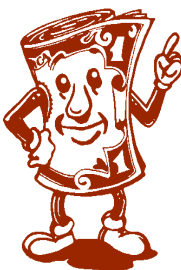
The multiplication of the loaves happens in our fields every year between sowing and harvest

And just as Jesus needed the hands of the apostles to distribute the bread to the people, God now needs human hands to make this abundance available to the hungry. In some countries today the problem is over-eating. In other countries, the problem is having anything to eat at all. Today we don't need anyone to multiply the loaves for us. The food is there. What is not always there is the will to share it.

Each day, bring your deepest needs and your small gifts to Jesus in prayer, receive His love in the Eucharist, and share what you have—time, compassion, food, forgiveness, or encouragement—with someone in need. God satisfies the hunger of the heart, Christ's love remains with us in every trial, and the little we place in His hands becomes a blessing for many. Amen.

GENERATION TO GENERATION CAMPAIGN PROJECT UPDATE

Our Generation to Generation Campaign goal was \$530,000, and thanks to the generosity of our supporters, we raised \$676,045, with a few donations still coming in. While these funds will not cover the entire cost of our project, they will provide significant support and help offset a portion of the expenses. Here's what we have done so far.

Some of you may have noticed that we have already begun installing air conditioning in several of our classrooms. This improvement not only enhances comfort but also makes the space more appealing to potential renters. After conducting thorough research, obtaining multiple bids, and carefully evaluating our options and costs, we determined that individual energy-efficient window units were the most practical and cost-effective solution.

We are also continuing to work with the elevator company. They have completed an inspection of both the elevator and its electrical system and were awaiting approval from the Village of Lansing before proceeding. We have now received that approval and are currently waiting for the elevator company to resume work. We are hopeful that the project will move forward within the next month.

The bathrooms may take longer because we are dealing with structural changes to the building.

As I mentioned previously, these improvements take time. Because we receive campaign funds through quarterly distributions, we are carefully planning and working with the resources available to us. Please know that I will continue to keep you informed of our progress every step of the way.

Thank you again for your generosity, your patience, and all that you do for our parish and for one another.

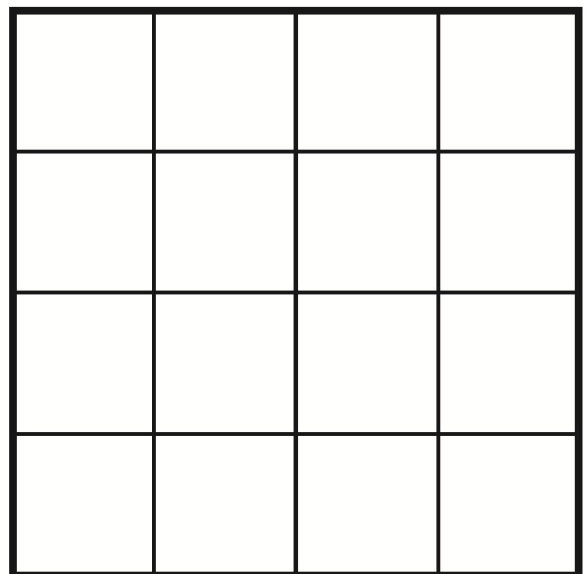
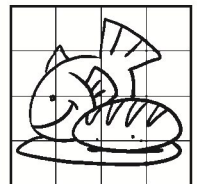
