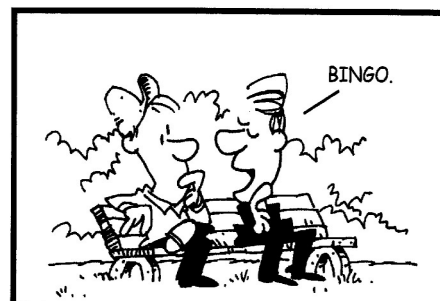

ASSUMPTION





**NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:
Walking on Water**

The readings for today invite all of us to recognize God's presence when life is noisy, fearful, or uncertain. Elijah discovers the Lord not in dramatic power but in a quiet whisper; Paul reveals a heart burdened with love for those who have not received Christ; and Peter learns that faith means keeping his eyes fixed on Jesus amid the storm.

A doctor phoned his patient one afternoon and told him, "I have some bad news and some worse news. The bad news is that all your tests show you have 24 hours to live." The patient said, "What could be worse than that?" The doc answered, "I've been trying to reach you since yesterday."

Pope John Paul II became pope in October 1978. There was lots of bad news then. The cold war was threatening world peace. Modern culture was destroying traditional social and moral values. Priests and nuns were abandoning their vocations in huge numbers. Conservatives and liberals were battling over the implementation of Vatican II. His message to the Church and the world at the beginning of his long pontificate are the words we hear in today's Gospel: "Be not afraid."

Fear, of course, is a healthy thing when it motivates us to protect ourselves from some threat to our wellbeing or that of those we love. Fear stimulates us emotionally to prepare for fight or flight. But a lot of people are consumed by fears that are groundless, irrational, or things we can do nothing about except pray.

Today's readings speak to any one of us who has ever felt overwhelmed: by bad news, family worries, illness, grief, financial pressure, conflict, or uncertainty about the future. In such moments, we may ask, "Lord, where are You? Why do You seem silent?"

Elijah knew that experience. In the first reading (1 Kgs 19:9a, 11-13a), he is on Mount Horeb, exhausted and afraid. He had witnessed God's power before, but now he is discouraged and hiding. Then there comes a violent wind, an earthquake, and a fire—powerful signs that could easily capture anyone's attention. Yet the Lord is not found in any of them. Afterward comes "a tiny whispering sound," a gentle stillness, and there Elijah encounters God. This is a lesson for our spiritual life. We often look for God only in the extraordinary: a sudden miracle, a dramatic answer, a powerful emotion, or a complete solution to our problems. But God often comes quietly. He speaks through Scripture read slowly, through the silence after Holy Communion, through the counsel of a wise person, through a child's need, through the patient love of a spouse, through the hidden duty we carry out faithfully. The world is full of wind, earthquakes, and fire. There is the noise of social media, criticism, political division, anxiety, work, schedules, and constant distraction. If our hearts are always filled with noise, we may fail to hear the Lord's gentle voice. Elijah teaches us to make room for silence, not an empty silence, but a silence attentive to God.

In the Gospel (Mt 14:22-33), the disciples are in another kind of storm. Their boat is being tossed by waves while Jesus is away on the mountain praying. They struggle through the night, and just before dawn Jesus comes toward them, walking on the sea. At first, they did not recognize Him. Fear distorts their vision. They think he is a ghost. Then Jesus speaks the words that every

anxious heart needs to hear: "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid." Notice that Jesus does not first remove the wind. He first reveals Himself. His presence is the disciples' security. The storm is real, but it is not greater than the Lord. The waves are strong, but they are beneath His feet. The darkness is real, but Jesus comes to them before dawn.

There are times when we want Jesus to change our situation immediately. Sometimes He does. But often he begins by changing our fear into trust. He says, "Take courage. it is I." The answer to fear is not to pretend that nothing is wrong. The answer is recognizing who is with us in the storm. Peter responds with boldness, "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water." Jesus gives one simple command: "Come." Peter steps out of the boat. For a moment, he walks on water. This is not because Peter is naturally strong or fearless. He walks because his eyes are on Jesus. But when he notices the wind and the waves, he becomes afraid and begins to sink. Peter's experience is our experience. We can begin the day with faith, prayer, and courage. Then an unexpected problem appears, an unkind word is spoken, a bill arrives, a diagnosis is received, or a relationship becomes difficult. We look away from Christ and fix our eyes on the storm. Anxiety takes over, and we begin to sink.

But even then, Peter teaches us what to do. He does not hide, pretend, or give up. He cries out, "Lord, save me!" That may be the most honest and powerful prayer we can make. "Lord, save me. Lord, help me. Lord, I cannot carry this alone." Immediately, Jesus stretches out His hand and catches Peter. The Lord does not wait for Peter to become perfect before helping him. He reaches out in mercy. This Gospel is not a story about Peter's failure; it is a story about Christ's faithfulness. Peter's faith may be weak, but Jesus' hand is strong. When we are sinking in fear, temptation, discouragement, or sorrow, Jesus is still near enough to grasp us.

Saint Paul gives another dimension to today's message. In the second reading (Rom 9:1-5), he speaks of his deep sorrow for his own people, Israel, who have received so many gifts from God: adoption, glory, covenants, worship, promises, patriarchs, and above all, Christ according to the flesh. Paul's words reveal the heart of a missionary. He does not look down on those who do not believe. He grieves for them, prays for them, and desires their salvation. We may have relatives, friends, children, grandchildren, or coworkers who have drifted from faith, stopped coming to Mass, or seem far from the Lord. Paul teaches us not to react with anger, judgment, or despair. We are called to carry them in prayer and love. We cannot force another person's heart to change, but we can witness faithfully, speak with patience, and entrust them to the mercy of God. The Church, too, is often like the boat in the Gospel, moving through difficult waters, facing resistance, confusion, and weakness among her members. Yet Christ has not abandoned His Church. He comes to her in the darkness. He speaks His word. He gives Himself in the Eucharist. He says again, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid." At every Mass, Jesus comes to us. He comes quietly, humbly, under the appearance of bread and wine. The same Lord who came to Elijah in a whisper and walked across the stormy sea comes to us at this altar. He does not merely tell us to be brave on our own. He gives us His own presence, His mercy, and His strength.

So today, let us bring our storms to Jesus: the fears we carry, the burdens we cannot control, the people for whom we worry, and the places where our faith feels weak. Let us ask for the grace to listen for His quiet voice, to step forward when He says

"Come," and to cry out without shame when we need help, "Lord, save me." When Jesus enters the boat, the wind dies down. When Christ enters the center of our lives, He may not remove every difficulty at once, but He gives a peace the storm cannot take away. What can we do to live the message we heard from these readings all week:

- Spend five quiet minutes each day with no phone, television, or distractions. Read a short passage of Scripture, especially the Gospel, and ask, "Lord, what are You saying to me?"
- When anxiety rises, pray slowly: "Jesus, it is You. I will not be afraid. Lord, save me."
- Identify one "storm" you are carrying and place it deliberately in Jesus' hands during prayer or before the Blessed Sacrament.
- Reach out with patience to one person who seems distant from the faith. Do not argue; show Christ through kindness, listening, and prayer.

- At Mass, receive the Eucharist with renewed faith that Jesus is entering the boat of your life and bringing His presence into your fears.

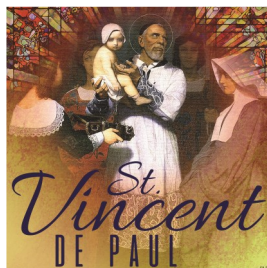
This week do not let the waves have the final word. Keep turning your eyes toward Christ, listen for His quiet voice, and trust the hand He extends to you. The storm may be real, but Jesus is nearer, stronger, and faithful. Like Peter we too have often set out confidently across the waters of life. However, as soon as the winds of trouble rise against us, and the waves of adversity begin to buffet us, we lose our nerve and begin to sink.

Lord, when our faith falters, as it often does, may we hear your gentle voice saying to us, "Courage! Do not be afraid." In that moment, Lord, may Your divine power uphold us, calm our fears, steady our nerves, and enable us to steer our little boat to a place of safety and peace, beyond the wind and the waves. So, He is with us at every Mass we participate in, telling us as He told the Apostles: "be not afraid." Amen.

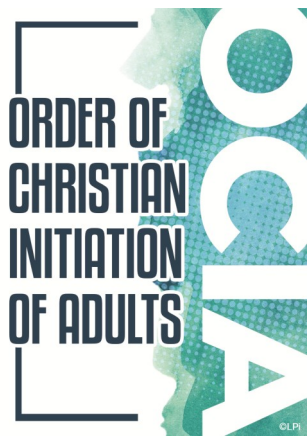

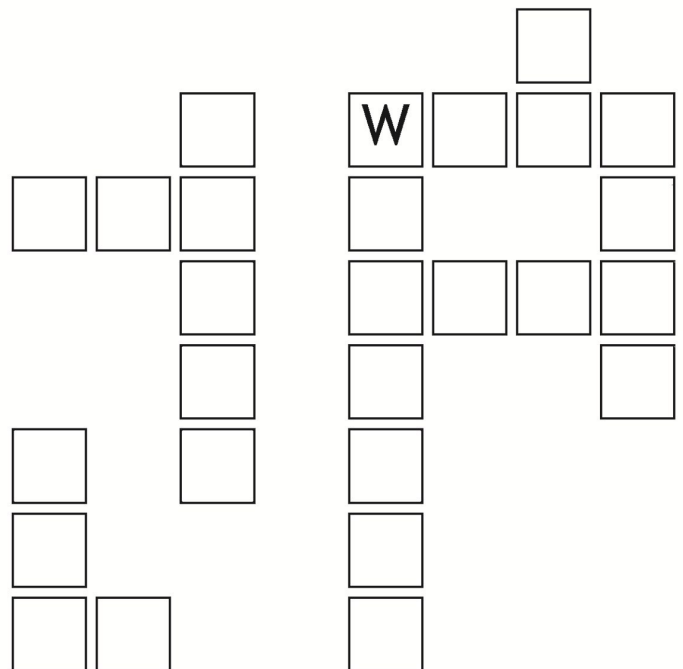
